

From The CEO

The 2019 WA Local Government elections are due to be held on 19 October, however an election will not be required for the Shire of Cue. At the close of nominations, four nominations had been received for the four vacancies created by the expiration of the terms of office of Councillors Ross Pigdon, Les Price, Ron Hogben and Leonie Fitzpatrick, with those Councillors all renominating and being re-elected for a further four year term expiring in 2023.

If you are aware of a community member who has made a significant contribution to the Cue community and you would like to see them acknowledged, nominations for the Australia Day Active Citizenship Award are now open. Nomination forms can be collected from the Shire office.

In case you were wondering why there is a blue tree in Austin Street, this is part of a social campaign to highlight the issue of mental health. The Blue Tree Project started in WA and has spread throughout Australia, helping raise awareness around mental wellbeing. For further information on this important issue, head to the Blue Tree Project website or Facebook page.

The Murdoch University Vet Program returns to Cue on Sunday 20 October from 8:00am to 5:00pm. Students from the university will be providing free pet checks and sterilisation under the guidance of a senior vet. Other services available include microchipping and vaccination at the owner's expense. Please note that this service is provided by the Shire of Cue and can only be provided to dogs and cats registered with the Shire. Bookings are essential and can be made through the Shire office.

Dog owners are reminded of their obligations to keep their dogs contained within the boundaries of their property or on a leash while walking. The Shire Ranger visits the area frequently and will take action to seize dogs that are found wandering in the street. This may result in a financial penalty to the owner and potential destruction of offending animals. While I have previously been lenient and issued warnings to owners walking their dogs off leash, it is clear that the message is not getting through and on the spot \$200 fines will have to be imposed in order to protect those members of the community doing the right thing. The only authorised area within the town site where dogs are permitted to be exercised off leash is the oval.



Shire of Cue Projects Update

There has been plenty going on behind the scenes here at the Shire – I thought I might share with you where some of our projects are at!

Cue Heritage Discovery Centre

We are getting ready to pour the concrete slab for the centre, then the building will be going up around mid-October. The concept designs are complete, allowing us to showcase some of the wonderful artefacts we have here in Cue. Here is the concept for the inside of the building – it has some outback colours showing!

Guided Audio Tour

A new tour of Cue that includes storytelling and audio guides for the buildings and town is being developed in conjunction with the Cue Heritage Discovery Centre. This immersive experience will allow people to not only hear the stories, but see the old buildings as they once were. Once launched, the guide will be free for all tourists, and will be hosted on an app that is global in scale, putting Cue up there on the same platform with New York, Ankhor Wat, San Francisco, London and others!

Railway Station

We have applied for funding through Lotterywest and are just waiting on the outcome of this application. In the meantime, we have approval from Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage for our plans for the building.

Bank of New South Wales

An application has been made for grant funding to repair and refurbish this lovely building into a commercial premises. If we can find the right business to go in, it will be one more set of doors open on Austin St, making the streetscape look more engaged and active.




Walking Trail up Cue Hill

A new trail location has been identified and we have applied for funding to create a new walking trail up Cue Hill. This will help keep our pedestrians that like to walk up the hill for exercise safe from vehicle/ pedestrian interactions, as well as creating some lovely lookouts on the way up.

Resurfacing of the Basketball Courts

The contractors will be here on the 15th October to repair, resurface and remark the lines on our basketball/ tennis courts. They will be here for about a week to get the work done, the courts will be a lovely shade of blue by the time they are finished!




Pump Track

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE CUE-MOON-ITY



Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) vaccine for adults

A new free adult measles vaccination program has been announced for Western Australians born during or after 1966, who have not already received two doses of a measles-containing vaccine.

Why has this program been introduced?

There is a global outbreak of measles putting individuals who are not fully vaccinated at risk of catching the disease. Naturally occurring measles has been eliminated from WA for approximately 20 years but occasional cases and small outbreaks still occur. This is— usually associated with tourists or WA residents who are infected overseas.

As a result, the number of measles cases in WA has been increasing in recent years, with 36 reported in 2018. Of the 36 infections last year, nearly three-quarters (73%) occurred among people aged 20 to 49 years of age. So far, 16 cases have been reported in 2019.

Why is the vaccine available to those born after 1966?

The program addresses an important gap in the community's protection against measles, as people born prior to 1966 are usually immune to measles due to having the illness as a child. People 19 years of age and younger are already eligible for free measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine through the National Immunisation Program.

Who should receive the vaccine?

All individuals born during or after 1966 who have not already received two documented doses of a measles vaccine. Adults born during or after 1966 are requested to check that they have received two documented doses of a measles vaccine at some stage in their life, especially if they plan to travel overseas.

Where can individuals receive this vaccine?

Eligible adults can receive this vaccine from their General Practitioner, Aboriginal Medical Services, travel clinic or community health immunisation clinics.

What are the costs involved?

The vaccine is provided at no cost through a State Government program, but consultation fees might be required if sought privately.

At the age of sixteen Robin Scott came from Scotland with his parents to Western Australia, where he enrolled as an apprentice electrician. Immensely proud of his trade, Robin has worked for more than 30 years as an electrical contractor to the WA mining industry, especially the Goldfields. Flying himself and his staff to electrical contracting assignments, Robin logged 4,000 hours in his Rockwell Commander, the aircraft he now uses to service his constituents in the vast Mining and Pastoral Region.

Robin is an enthusiastic campaigner for job opportunities through creating more apprenticeships for young men and young women.
