Seven Golden Rules for Prospecting



1. Obtain a Miner's Right permit
when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office).

2. Put safety first

- Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.
- Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) – it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

3. Obtain a 40E permit
prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).

4. Get written permission
from the tenement holder when prospecting on:

- a mining lease
- an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)
- a prospecting licence

5. Comply with all legal requirements
when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.

6. Show respect when on Crown land
because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.

7. Fill any holes
that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.

DID YOU KNOW ... that the maximum penalty for an individual prospecting illegally is \$150,000



FROM THE CEO

Council is continuing to make representations to State Government regarding increasing staffing levels at nursing posts throughout the state. A petition is currently circulating calling for a second nurse to be allocated to the Cue Nursing Post. Residents and visitors alike are encouraged to sign the petition.

Work is progressing on repairing and refurbishing the Bank of NSW, purchased by the Shire last year. Council is inviting input from the community regarding ideas for the use of this building. Suggestions so far include offices, a restaurant and a bakery. The Shire is willing to fit out the building appropriately and offer an attractive rental to accommodate a suitable business that will be beneficial to the community.

Rate notices have recently been distributed. If you haven't received yours yet, please contact the Shire office. The Shire is again offering the chance to win a rates incentive prize to ratepayers who pay their rates in full by 5 October 2020. Eligible entries will go into the draw for the opportunity to receive a \$600 first prize, with \$300 for second and \$100 for third.

The next meeting of Cue Parliament will be held on Friday 27 November. Members of the Murchison Zone of the WA Local Government Association will gather to discuss topics relevant to the Murchison region and Local Government generally. A number of prominent State Government representatives are expected to attend. With the state election due in March, it is likely to be well attended by both current and aspiring members of parliament.

The Murdoch University Vet Program would ordinarily be run in Cue during October, providing free pet checks and sterilisation. Unfortunately, due to COVID-19 restrictions, the program will not be run in 2020.



Dog owners are reminded of their obligations to keep their dogs contained within the boundaries of their property or on a leash while walking. The Shire Ranger visits the area frequently and will take action to seize dogs that are found wandering in the street. This may result in a financial penalty to the owner and potential destruction of offending animals. The only authorised area within the town-site where dogs are permitted to be exercised off-leash is the town oval.

If you are aware of a community member who has made a significant contribution to the Cue community and you would like to see them acknowledged, nominations for the Australia Day Active Citizenship Award are now open. Nomination forms can be collected from the Shire office.

For those of you that don't know me I am Hon Robin Scott MLC. I was sworn in on 22 May 2017 as a Member of the Legislative Council of Western Australia, representing Mining and Pastoral Region for Pauline Hanson's One Nation.

I would like to start by saying for the past thirty years I have been interested in politics, and just like you I have been forced to vote at every election for the best of a bad bunch. Being a father of two and grandfather of six it motivated me to maximize my contribution as a parliamentarian. I'm here for the people of my electorate not the people of the house. ✓ Achievements

- ✓ **Blocked - The State Government's proposal to raise the gold royalty** - In 2017 I was Successful with the Disallowance Motion which defeated the Government's attempt to increase the Gold Royalty by 50%. Which I think is an absolutely fantastic win. I am determined to protect and promote mining and lead the defence against water charges for prospectors and small miners.
- ✓ **Granted - License for an MRI Machine in Kalgoorlie-Boulder** -Alongside Senator Georgiou we secured the Medicare license for the MRI machine in June 2018 after leading a strong advocacy campaign alongside WA One Nation. Although our town is still waiting for the MRI Machine i reassure you that I will continue to ask the question and update my electorate as to when we can expect it to be operating.
- ✓ **Granted - Funding for Palliative Care** - I accomplished a desired result with obtaining a multi-million-dollar funding injection for Palliative care in regional WA. I was disappointed to hear that the government had again let our people down with in the health department and knew that people deserved to die with dignity.
- ✓ **Blocked Removal of Education components with School of the air** - I won the fight with members of the cross bench when the state government proposed that they wanted to remove critical education components with School.

- **Advocating the PHON plan to subsidise apprenticeships by 75% in the first year, 50% in the second year and 25% in the third year.**
- **Investigate unfair Native Title Claims**
- **Create Suitable accommodation in regional towns for remote community visitors.**
- **Continue to follow up on the current status of the MRI machine for the Kalgoorlie Health Campus.**
- **Begin the construction on the Kimberly Water Pipelines.**
- **Bring Royalties for Regions back to Regional WA.**
- **Continue to push for the Wiluna to Meekatharra road to be sealed.**

MONSTER BURGERS

INGREDIENTS

Sliced cheese
1 TBS olive oil
Beef Burgers
Charcoal Brioche buns
iceburg lettuce
1 tomato, thinly sliced
cherry tomatoes, halved
tomato sauce to serve
black olives
fries, to serve

DIRECTIONS

1.


Place cheese slices on clean work surface. Use a small sharp knife to cut triangles from one edge of each slice to make fangs.

2.

Heat the oil in a large frying pan over medium heat. Add beef patties and cook for 3 minutes or until brown underneath. Turn and cook for a further 3 minutes. Top the beef patties with cheese.

3.

Divide bun bases among serving plates. Top with lettuce & sliced tomato and drizzle with tomato sauce. Top with bun tops. Place the cherry tomato halves on top of each roll to make eyes. Cut tops from olives and place on the cherry tomatoes to make pupils. Serve with fries.



HALLOWEEN CUPCAKES

INGREDIENTS

Buttercake cake mix
2 eggs
60g butter, softened
3/4 cup milk
180g pack smarties
1 cup dark choc melts

ICING

250g unsalted butter, softened
2 1/2 cups icing sugar mix
yellow food colouring
green food colouring

DIRECTIONS

1.


Make cupcakes following packet directions. Spoon mixture into cases until 3/4 full. Bake for 25 minutes in 180 degree oven, or until skewer comes out clean. Turn onto wire rack to cool.

2.

Make icing using an electric mixer, butter butter until pale. Gradually add icing sugar mixture, beating constantly until combined. Tint lime green by mixing food colourings.

3.

Spread cupcakes with icing. Press 3 smarties into tops for spider bodies. Place chocolate in a microwave safe bowl. Microwave on medium for 2 minutes 30 seconds, stirring with a metal spoon every 30 seconds, or until melted and smooth. Spoon chocolate into snap lock bag. Make a small snip in 1 corner. Pipe chocolate around smarties to form spider legs and eyes. Set aside for 10 minutes or until set. Serve.
