FROM THE CEO

I am back on board after a short break in Tasmania and happy to be soaking up the warmer weather. It was a pleasant surprise when the State Government lifted border restrictions on some travellers and I was able to re-enter the state without having to serve a quarantine period.

The Murchison Country Zone of the WA Local Government Association held their most recent biannual meeting, affectionately known as Cue Parliament, at the Cue Shire Hall on Friday 27 November. The Minister for Local Government; Heritage; Culture and The Arts, David Templeman MLA, opened the meeting by video conference and addressed those in attendance on local government issues, in particular the ongoing development of a new Local Government Act and the outstanding response by local governments across the state to the COVID-19 pandemic. Representatives from the Shires of Cue, Meekatharra, Mount Magnet, Murchison, Sandstone and Yalgoo also heard from several senior government representatives on matters affecting the Murchison Region. Water Corporation Regional Manager, Steve Greeve, gave an update on the project to improve water quality in the Murchison, noting that the new water treatment plant in Cue is scheduled to be operational in March/April 2021.

One of the preliminary events for Cue Parliament is the running of the Cue Calcutta Cup, organised with assistance from the Cue CRC and Shire of Cue by Regional Development Australia and this year sponsored by the Water Corporation. Attendees purchased tickets for the opportunity to secure a horse in a phantom race, with this year's event being the first with a live race call. The lucky winner was Ross Pigdon, who took home a magnificent hand-made trophy. Over \$1500 was raised on the night for the Royal Flying Doctor Service.

With the recent expansion of mining and exploration activity occurring throughout the Shire, I am receiving an increasing number of enquiries about the availability of houses in town to rent or buy. If anybody has a property that is available, just visit, call or email the Shire office and we will pass on the details.

New kerbing has been installed on sections of Marshall & Wittenoom Streets to control storm water in this area. The verge area will be backfilled with gravel over the next few weeks.

Volunteers Night has been shifted from the previously advertised date of 5 December to Wednesday 2 December to accommodate the very talented Emmet, who is always a great entertainer. This event has been traditionally held on 5 December to coincide with International Volunteers Day, however from 2021, we will be holding Volunteers Night to coincide with National Volunteering Week, which is celebrated in May.

The Shire will again be running a competition to determine the households or business premises that present the best Christmas displays, so get into the spirit of Christmas and dress up your property for the chance to win cash prizes. Decorations don't have to be lights, but the more colour the better. Entry forms are available from the Shire office, or use the one in this publication, with winners to be selected after the Council meeting on Tuesday 15 December.

The Cue Community Christmas Party will be held on Saturday 12 December in the Shire Hall, commencing at 6:00pm. Food and refreshments will be provided. Santa is expected to arrive at 6:30pm.

The Shire was happy to learn that our application to Lotterywest for \$50K to fund an end of year music event has been successful. Adam Brand and supporting artists, including some very talented locals, will be live in concert at the town oval on Saturday 19 December. This event will be free to all, however people wishing to attend are required to obtain an online ticket so that the Shire can monitor attendance numbers and record attendee details for COVID-19 contact tracing. Tickets are available from eventbrite.com.au, search for events in Cue or by artist Adam Brand. Signing up for an account is not necessary, with name, contact number and email all that is required to secure your place.

The Shire office and depot will close at 12 noon on Friday 18 December for the annual Christmas shut down. The office and depot will both re-open on Monday 4 January 2021. On behalf of the Councillors and staff of the Shire of Cue, I wish everyone a safe and happy Christmas and New Year. Let's hope 2021 is a better year than 2020!

St John Ambulance Cue Sub Centre

This year has really blown by, and our volunteer team here in Cue has been kept busy this year. We have had a few changes over the year – we have a new permanent Country Paramedic (Michelle Fyfe) looking after us. You may have seen Michelle around town, particularly on a Thursday when she is here for Ambo training.

We are also sad to see the retirement of two of our long term volunteer ambulance officers from active duty — Jenni Dennis and Udo Kaschner. Both have provided significant years of service to our team, and while both will be involved with St Johns in a volunteer support capacity, they will no longer be on active duty. When you do see them around town, please take the time to thank them for their years of service to this town, it has been greatly appreciated, and should be acknowledged for the amazing contribution they have made.

Ian Dennis has also stepped down as Chairman of the Cue Sub-Centre but will remain a part of our wonderful team – his leadership has been, guiding us through the last few years, ensuring our sub-centre has remained operational, including organising of a temporary second ambulance, and the purchase of a permanent second vehicle for the town. He has also seen us through a peak in the number of callouts responded to by the team. A big thank you to Ian for your leadership and support.

The purchase of the second ambulance for Cue has been on the agenda for the last few months, and we were recently given the opportunity to purchase the vehicle at Mount Magnet, which has been approved. So we now have two ambulances again for Cue. We couldn't have done this without the support of Joyce and Daryl at the Queen of the Murchison - the very kind donation they made to the purchase of the vehicle was a big step in ensuring we could go forward with acquiring the vehicle. The Shire of Cue also deserve a shout out for their generous donation towards the purchase of the ambulance as well. So a very big THANK YOU to both for your support of our emergency services.

One final thank you – to all our Ambulance Volunteers. You guys are amazing! In 2020, our volunteers donated 255 hours of their time to supporting our community. Some of our volunteers have given almost 2 full weeks of volunteer time, just in call outs alone. Add in 108 hours of training by our team over the course of the year, and each of our vollies has donated around 52 hours each this year. Their dedication to ensuring they provide a high level of professional service when responding to calls in Cue and surrounding areas is noted and appreciated.


Recycling Revenue.



YOUTH COORDINATOR

Position:

The Shire of Cue is currently looking for a dedicated individual to fill the role of Youth Coordinator.

The Cue Railway Station is currently undergoing a complete renovation and on completion will be home to the new Youth and Community Centre for Cue. From this location the Youth Coordinator will be responsible for the delivery of youth focused programs that encourage positive engagement with the youth of Cue.

You will be building connections with the young people in town, particularly in the development of new programs in arts and crafts/ sports/ caring for country and more that actively engage our youth.

The position includes providing after school and weekend educational, social and recreational programs for local youth. The role is part time, up to forty hours per fortnight with an indicative salary range of \$28,881 to \$39,269, plus other benefits offered by the Shire of Cue.

Experience in a related field is desirable but not essential as the Shire of Cue is prepared to provide training for the right applicant. The position requires basic administrative skills such as time keeping, report writing and computer skills.

If you are someone who is driven to making a positive impact in the community and has established leadership skills, then this role might be perfect for you.

To be considered for this position the successful candidate will be able to demonstrate:

- Previous experience in a Youth focused support role
- · Previous experience working with aboriginal people in remote locations

SMOKEN SALMON WREATH

RECIPE

INGREDIENTS

1 fennel bulb

3 limes

2 green shallots

3 large ripe avocados

250g baby cucumbers, ribboned

1 bunch radish, thinly sliced

extra virgin olive oil, to drizzle

creme fraiche, to serve

salmon roe, to serve

dill, to serve

micro herbs, to serve

crackers or crusty bread, to serve

METHOD

STEP 1

Use a mandoline to thinly slice the fennel length ways. place in a large bowl with the juice of 1 lime. Add a large pinch of salt, toss to combine and set aside to pickle.

STEP 2

Cut shallots into 8cm lengths and thinly slice length ways. place in a bowl of iced water for 2 - 3 minutes or until lightly curled. Drain well. Roughly mash the avocados in a bowl. Add the juice from the remaining limes, season and stir to combine.

STEP 3

Drain fennel. Arrange avocado in a heaped circle around the edge of a large plate. arrange pickled fennel, cucumber, shallot and salmon over the top. Drizzle with oil and season with pepper. Dollop on creme fraiche and salmon roe. Scatter with the dill and herbs. Serve immediately with crackers or bread.



WHITE CHRISTMAS ICE-CREAM SANDWICHES

INGREDIENTS

60g ice-cream wafers 375ml thickened cream 395g sweetened condensed milk 270ml coconut cream

70g rice bubbles 160g frozen raspberries 290g white choc melts, melted

20g shredded coconut, toasted

40g chopped pistachios

METHOD

STEP 1

Line a slice pan with 2 layers of cling wrap, extending over the sides 10cm. Arrange wafers leaving a 2cm gap down the middle of the pan.

STEP 2

Whisk cream & condensed milk until soft peaks form. Gradually add coconut milk & whisk until just combined. Fold in rice bubbles & frozen raspberries until just combined. Carefully spoon over wafers & smooth the surface. Cover with remaining wafers to line up with the base wafers. Fold over cling wrap and freeze for 4hrs.

STEP 3

When firm lift the slab out of the pan onto a chopping board. Trim off the excess around wafers & down the 2cm centre gap. Working from the centre, carefully slice the slab into 12 wafer sized sandwiches. Place on a baking paper lined tray and return to the freezer for 1hr before decorating.

STEP 4

Taking one ice-cream sandwich from freezer at a time, dip one end into melted chocolate to come 2cm up the sides. Sprinkle half the sandwiches with coconut and half with pistachio. Return sandwiches to freezer for 1hr to set.
