The Shire has experienced heavy rain in early April across the Shire. This will hopefully bring some benefits to pastoralists and increase the potential for an impressive wildflower display for our visitors. On the down side it has caused damage to Shire roads. A number of Shire roads are waiting on repairs to damage from the rain event. Unfortunately, the rules of the federal assistance we receive to respond to such events, prevents the Shire from doing anything more than making the road passable until a lengthy assessment process is completed. Road users are asked to take care when travelling, particularly at flood crossings. Please drive to the road conditions and observe any traffic directions.

The ANZAC Day memorial service held at Arthur Stanley Memorial Park was well attended with over a hundred people up early for the dawn service. This will be followed by breakfast at the Murchison Club Hotel.

ANZAC Biscuits

Anzac biscuits are steeped in the history of World War I and the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps. The biscuits emerged as a favourite for loved ones and women's groups to send to the ANZAC soldiers at Gallipoli. The omission of eggs was in part because of rationing but it also helped the biscuits keep for the long voyage. Next time you bite into that crunchy golden biscuit, take a moment to reflect on the history of the ANZACs and take part in an event to commemorate April 25th.

Ingredients:

- 1 cup rolled oats
- 1 cup plain flour (sifted)
- 1 cup white sugar (half cup white and half cup brown will give a good snap if that is desired)
- 3/4 cup desiccated coconut
- 125 g butter (melted)
- 2 tablespoons golden syrup
- 1/2 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
- 1 tablespoon boiling water

Method:

1. Pre-heat oven to 160 degrees celcius and line trays with baking paper.
2. In a bowl mix together the dry ingredients - rolled oats, flour, sugar and coconut.
3. Into a saucepan, place the butter, golden syrup, bicarb soda and water. Stir and heat to boiling point.
4. Add the melted ingredients into the dry ingredients and mix thoroughly.
5. Roll tablespoon sized balls (32g if you want to be specific) in your hands and place on lined baking trays.
6. Cook for 15-20 minutes until light golden. Allow to cool on tray.

FEEDING BIRDS PART 3

Recently I counted 16 bird species in our yard over the course of one day, yet we do not feed birds at all. Instead we provide bird baths and numerous flowering native plants to attract them without endangering their health. Fortunately, we also have some large trees with suitable nesting hollows.

You certainly don't need to feed birds to have them in your garden.

Very little research has been conducted on the issue of supplementary feeding in Australia. People will nevertheless persist in feeding birds due to ignorance or possibly selfish reasons. Hopefully, through education, bird lovers who must continue to feed their feathered friends will provide a better quality supplement.

For example, 'Insectivore' can be purchased from local pet suppliers. This is a powdered nutritional supplement for birds. It can be added to good quality mince but it's very important to follow the directions on the pack and add just the right amount. Too little Insectivore and it won't work; too much and it will harm the bird.

Other quality foods include mealworms available from tackle shops and pet suppliers for around \$5 a packet. Crickets are also available from most pet suppliers. Garden worms are another good natural food.

Feed birds only occasionally just as a small treat. If you feed them too regularly the birds can become too reliant and suffer if you go away. It may also increase the mosquito and other insect populations as they are no longer being preyed upon.

The cheapest and healthiest option is to provide birds with water and flowering plants instead of feeding them junk food.

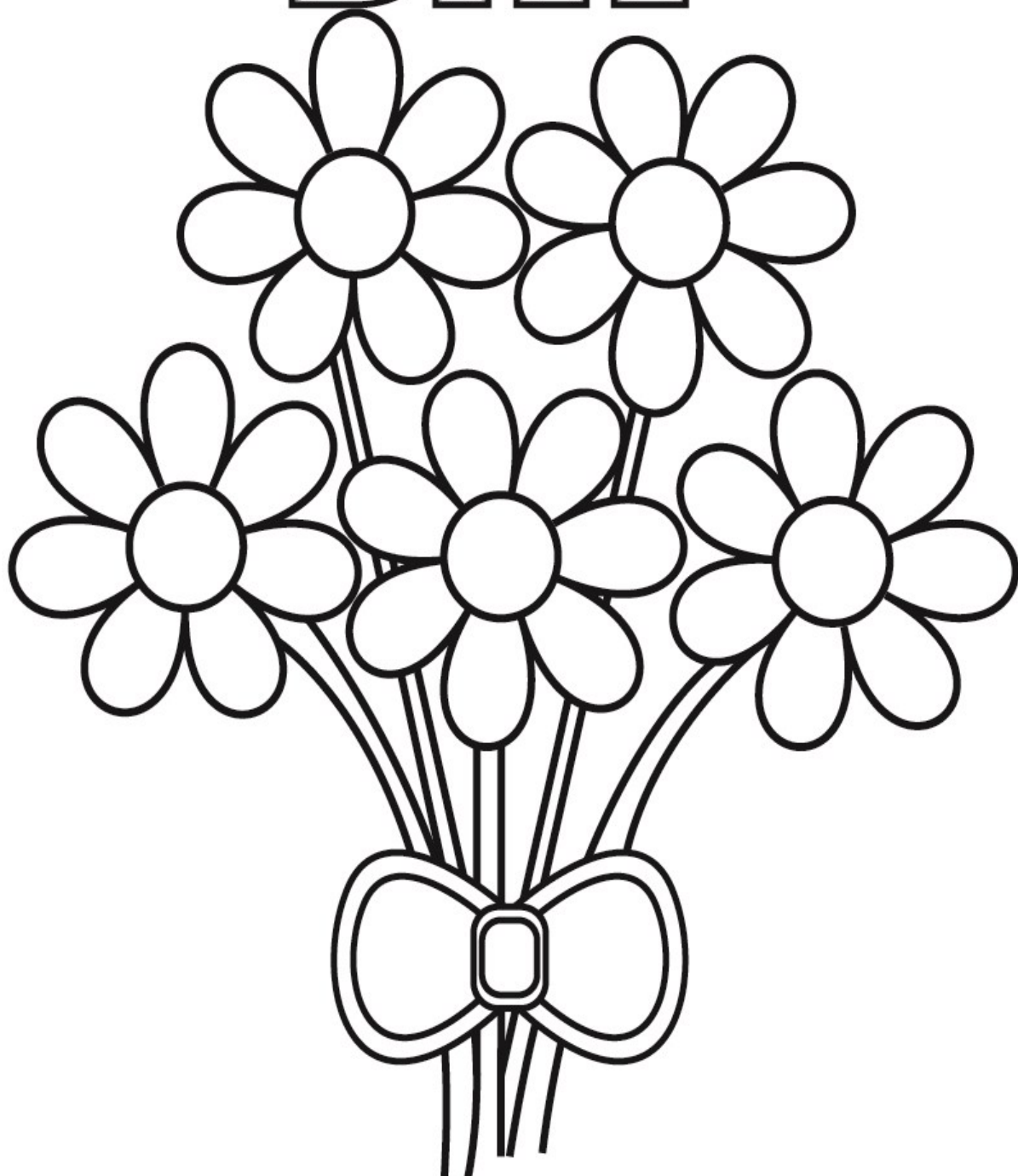

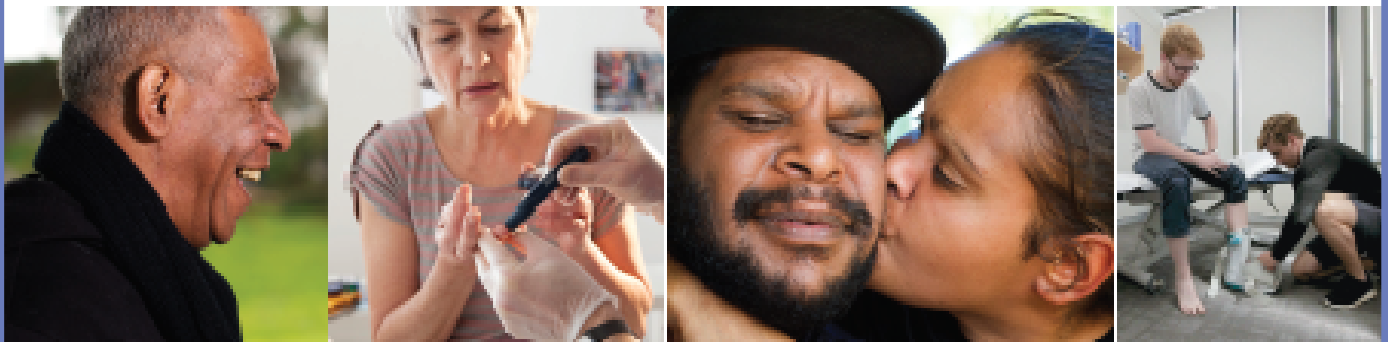

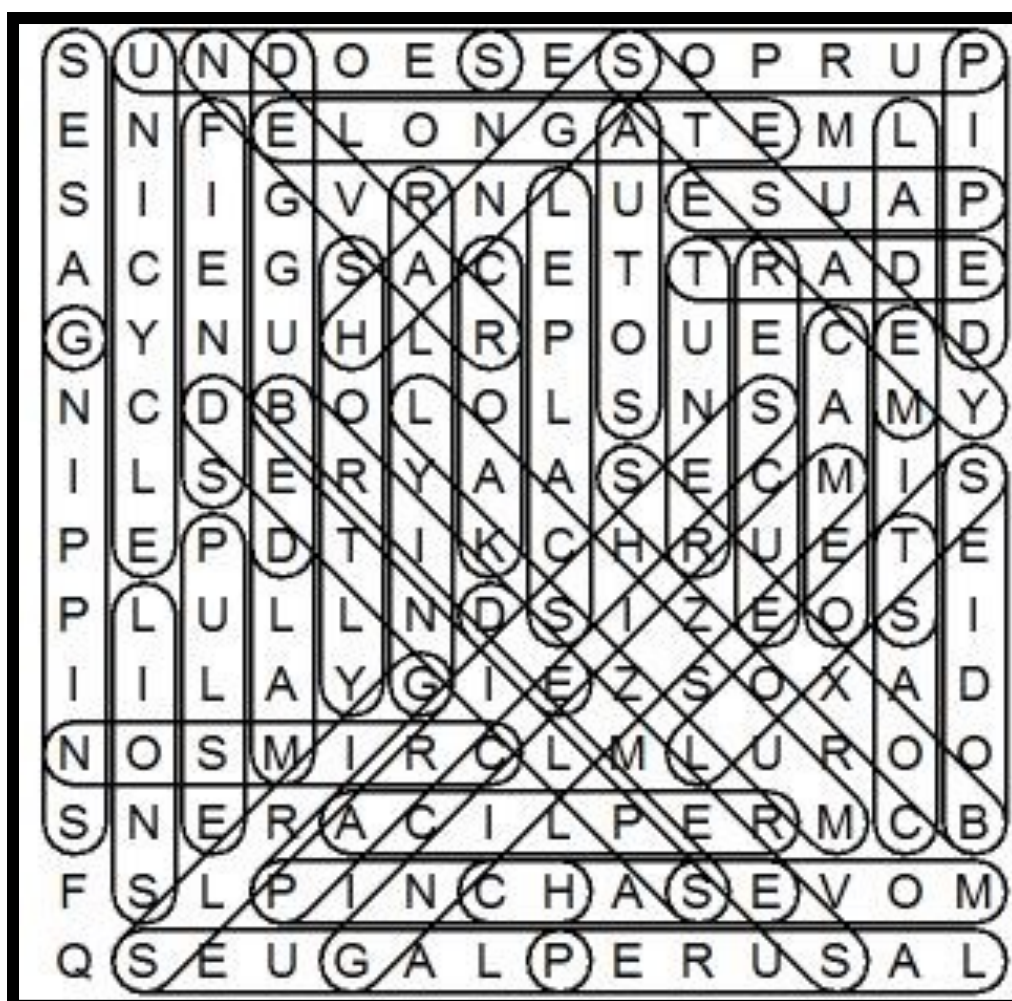
