

The Shire of Cue is seeking to appoint a mechanic to join our team, servicing a diverse fleet of small plant, light vehicles, trucks and machinery.

Situated in Western Australia's Murchison Region, the Shire of Cue is approximately 660kms north-east of Perth on the Great Northern Highway. It is a small town with a strong sense of history and community that supports gold and iron ore mining as well as pastoral and tourism industries.

The position offers a diverse role working on a variety of machinery and the opportunity to undertake other duties related to the operations of the Shire of Cue. The main duties of the role include, but are not limited to:

- carrying out scheduled service, maintenance and repairs or breakdown response on a diverse range of Councils fleet, plant and equipment
- identifying and diagnosing problems from electronic, hydraulic and mechanical systems
- reading equipment manuals and schematics; and keeping accurate service records across the entire range of Council operated fleet, plant and equipment
- opportunity to undertake steel fabrication, plant operation and other project work as required.
