FROM THE DESK OF THE CEO

Welcome

Tourist season is well underway and a warm welcome is extended to all visitors to Cue. The positive feedback on the improvements made to the town in recent times is certainly appreciated.

Footpath Program

Axiis Contracting have been awarded the tender for construction of the next stage of the Shire's footpath program, with new footpaths to be constructed on Dowley, McCarthy and Allen Streets. Additional sections of footpath may also be able to be constructed ahead of the planned time frame listed in the Shire's 14 year footpath program as the tender price received was less than anticipated. A site inspection will be conducted on Monday 7 May, with works expected to commence shortly after.

Roadworks

Contractors for Main Roads WA will shortly be commencing resurfacing of the main street through town. Traffic will be restricted to one lane, with traffic controllers in place for the duration. Works are expected to continue for several weeks. Preparations for additional sealing work on Beringarra-Cue Road are also ongoing.

Bowling Green


Installation of the Greenguage carpet, underlay and artificial turf surrounds to the bowling green adjacent to the Shire Hall has been completed by Synthetic Bowling Solutions. The green can accommodate up to three rinks to world bowls standards. Some additional landscaping and fencing is required to finish the facility, and outdoor furniture is expected to be delivered in the near future. Although not quite ready for full competition, a casual roll up will be held on Sunday 6 May from 4pm for anybody keen to try it out.

Movie Madness

Over the next few months, two film crews will be descending on Cue to begin production on separate projects. While one remains a mystery, details have emerged that the other will be a science fiction movie titled The Dust Walker. Based in the future, the storyline centres around a crashed spaceship that threatens to infect local townspeople with an alien zombie-like plague. In addition to the direct economic benefit to the town from accommodating and feeding cast and crew, there will also be the opportunity for budding stars to feature in the movie as extras.



The Decadent and Depraved, recently filmed at locations in WA including Cue, Sandstone and Yalgoo, and featuring a few locals as extras, will be screened at the Shire Hall on Tuesday 3 July. This will be a red carpet event, with lead actors attending. Plans are in place for a Western-themed dress-up competition on the night, with a prize package to be awarded for the best dressed. Keep an eye out for posters and other information to be released closer to the date. You will also need to keep your eyes peeled during the movie to catch my glorious death scene, as it is all over in a matter of seconds.





Cue Primary School students are learning AUSLAN as part of the curriculum and to help them communicate with a deaf student at the school.


We would like the Cue Community to get involved and learn some basic signs to communicate with deaf and hard of hearing people, which we will include in each addition of the Dryblower.





CRC's face a long, slow death after funding scrapped by WA Labor Government

Nationals WA Member for North West Central Vince Catania has said the funding cuts to Community Resource Centres (CRC's) announced by the Minister for Regional Development, Alannah MacTiernan compound the effects of the education cuts to regional WA.

The announcement by Alannah MacTiernan highlights that the WA Labor Government will deliver a funding cut of nearly 50% to many of the CRC's across regional WA.

Mr Catania said "This WA Labor Government keeps on hitting vitally important regional WA facilities, networks and programs like the CRC's with these cruel funding cuts just to prop up their Perth-based election promises at the expense of our bush communities."

"Mark McGowan has just received \$3.8 billion from Malcolm Turnbull and doesn't see fit to deliver any of that more than 100km from the Perth CBD. Even Malcolm's own words highlighted that this Labor Government had only put forward projects in Perth for the federal cash splash."

"CRC's are now the shopfront for many of the Government Departments and commercial services that have been taken away from our communities over the last few decades, providing valuable assistance for community groups, funding applications, banking and access to an IT network that can help people stay connected," Mr Catania said.

The proposed model, which separates centres into two tiers of funding, will result in operating budgets of individual centres cut by up to 50 per cent. It will also impact the ability of the CRC Network to deliver its traineeship program, which has helped up-skill 500 participants since 2014.

"This decision is a further blow to our regional communities that have been savaged by this WA Labor Governments scrapping and slashing of regional education, vital health facilities that have been de-funded and Aged Care funding slashed."

"Mark McGowan is unwilling to listen to the damage they is being done to regional communities that have already borne the brunt of the slow-down of the WA economy."

"Valuable opportunities to grow these regional communities that are striving to help grow and diversify the WA economy are being disrespected," Mr Catania said.

The Pilbara, Gascoyne and Midwest have a small number of CRC's which provide access to Centrelink, Medicare, vehicle and driver licensing, tourist information and Wi-Fi access.

Mr Catania said "Where is the outrage from all of these Country Labor MP's who keep racing to be at the front of the ribbon-cutting photos for all of the Royalties for Regions funded projects that the previous Liberal/Nationals Government initiated?"
