FROM THE DESK OF THE CEO

Congratulations to the organisers and volunteers who made the Cue Funday, held on Saturday 25 August, such a great event. The dinner dance in the evening saw many local residents strutting their stuff on the dance floor, the standout being local teacher Helene Salame who attempted to guide the rest of us through some very active dance moves.

The Water Corporation have announced that a contract has been awarded for the construction of four EDR water treatment plants to address water quality issues in Murchison towns, including Cue. The Cue plant is planned to be commissioned in early 2020. A more detailed summary of the project follows my report.

The next meeting of Cue Parliament will be held on Friday 2 November. Members of the Murchison Zone of the WA Local Government Association will gather to discuss topics relevant to the Murchison region and Local Government generally. A number of prominent State Government representatives are expected to attend.

The Shire is currently in the process of certifying the Cue Aerodrome to accept larger aircraft, at the request of Westgold, to assist them with their expanding operations. It is expected to take 6 - 8 months to achieve CASA approval. As part of this process, myself, Deputy CEO, Richard Towell, and Manager Works & Services, John Curtin, recently completed training to become qualified Airport Reporting Officers.

Westgold have decided to create a central presence in town for their administrative operations and have secured a lease on the old Municipal building in Robinson Street, with staff expected to be moving in over the next few weeks. This building was previously earmarked as a possible location for the Senior Citizens Cuerosity shop in case they were required to move from their current location, however the Shire has secured an alternative location which will retain their presence in the main street.

Preparations are almost complete for the resurfacing of the remainder of the Beringarra-Cue road to the Shire's Western boundary. It is hoped that sealing will be completed by December 2018, finalising this project. At the completion of the works, it is estimated that the Beringarra-Cue Road Reserve will contain approximately 2.8 million dollars for future maintenance of this road. Following completion of the Beringarra-Cue Road, the Shire workforce will then proceed to the Beebyn-Karbar Road to continue works on the flood damage funded by the WA Natural Disaster Relief & Recovery Arrangements.

After a lengthy search for a mechanic, the Shire has secured the services of Robert "Dunc" Connolly, previously of the Shire of Morawa. Dunc is a highly skilled and experienced mechanic and I am happy to welcome him to Cue.

At the council meeting of 21 August 2018, the annual budget for 2018/2019 was adopted incorporating a 0% increase in the rate in the dollar for residential, commercial and industrial properties in the Shire of Cue. Mining rates were reduced by approximately 1.8%. Rate notices are currently being distributed, with the Shire again offering the chance to win a rates incentive prize to ratepayers who pay their rates in full by 5 October 2018. Eligible entries will go into the draw for the opportunity to receive a \$600 first prize, with \$300 for second and \$100 for third.

Significant funding allocations in the 2018/2019 budget include:

- \$980,000 for the construction of two houses for the Government Regional Officers Housing scheme to accommodate police officers. Construction costs will be recovered through a leasing arrangement with the State Government over a period of 10 years.
- \$700,000 for staff housing additions.
- \$100,000 to commence the planning and design of future aged persons accommodation.
- \$301,333 for the Shire of Cue's contribution to the Murchison Regional Vermin Council dog fence should an application for funding through the Federal Government's Building Better Regions Fund not be successful.
- \$100,000 for new playground and outdoor exercise equipment.
- \$150,000 to design and construct a skate park.
- \$200,000 for Austin Street improvements.
- \$812,500 to fund the Shire's plant replacement program.
- \$90,000 to construct toilet facilities and \$25,000 for a niche wall at the Cue Cemetery.
- \$20,000 contribution to the Community Resource Centre's proposed Heritage Discovery Centre.
- \$70,000 to widen cattle grids on Shire roads.
- \$75,000 toward repurposing of the old railway station building.
- \$100,000 to progress plans for the relocation of the Great Fingal mine office.

Catania welcomes \$5 million CRC backflip by Labor

Nationals WA Member for North West Central Vince Catania has welcomed today's announcement by the WA Labor Government that they would cave in to community outrage and fully fund the Community Resource Centre network.

Mr Catania said that the decision by Premier Mark McGowan to make another backflip on his funding cuts for regional WA gives a little insight into the way this W Labor Government is being run.

"The decision to slash funding to the CRC network by 40 percent was another hair brained idea by a government focussed on retribution and division."

"Mark McGowan and his WA Labor Government has shown time and again how arrogant and out of touch they are with the needs of regional communities."

"There was just no need for the WA Labor Government to even consider implementing these cuts considering the very small cost that maintaining the full CRC network is to the State Budget, but the enormous benefits to regional communities that comes from them."

"For more than 4 months regional communities have had to endure the plans of Premier and his apprentice Alannah MacTieman taking to local CRC's with a hatchets. This has caused an incredible amount of pain and stress in those communities and for people employed across the CRC network", Mr Catania said.

In the May State Budget, Premier Mark McGowan announced that he would be slashing funding to all of the 105 Community Resource Centres across WA. Tier 1 CRC's would see funding reduced by 30%, while Tier 2 CRC's would have their funding slashed by 50%.

Mr Catania said "The fight still continues to reverse the rest of the cuts to regional education across WA. The fight isn't over, not by a long shot."

"The families and communities that rely on the essential education services that are offered by the Camp Schools, Agricultural Colleges and the Moora Residential College will be emboldened by yet another Mean Mark McGowan backflip."

"How many more times will Mark McGowan have to come in and save the people of regional WA from the disastrous decisions of his absentee Cabinet Ministers?"

Price welcomes Labor backflip on CRC funding

10th August 2018

Melissa Price, Federal Member for Durack, today welcomed the WA Labor Government's backflip on cutting funding to the State's Community Resource Centres (CRCs).

"These resource hubs play a vital part in the lives of people who live in regional areas," she said.

"It was an appalling decision by Regional Development Minister Alannah McTiernan and the State Government in April this year, to pull about \$5 million in funding from these centres.

"It is excellent news that the Premier, Mark McGowan and Alannah McTiernan, have listened to community concerns and reversed the terrible decision and have committed to funding the full \$13 million," said Ms Price.

"There are more than 35 CRCs in my electorate of Durack and I know how important they are to the community.

"Pulling funding would not only have reduced – or eliminated some programs – but also caused job losses, so this backflip is very welcome news.

"State Labor should now swallow their pride and listen to community concerns and reverse their decision on closing Moora Residential College."

Improving water quality in the Murchison



Project update - August 2018

Project overview

Water Corporation is progressing a \$16 million program to build water treatment plants in Mount Magnet, Cue, Sandstone and Meekatharra. The new water treatment plants will reduce the naturally high levels of salinity and nitrates in the water and improve scaling and hardness.

Why are we building new water treatment plants?

Community feedback has revealed strong support for improving water aesthetics and reducing nitrate levels.

To address this feedback, two treatment options were considered:

1. Construction of new water treatment plants in each town or
2. Rollout of in-house treatment units in each household (as trialled in Cue in 2016).

Following a review of maintenance and operating requirements for both alternatives, the most feasible treatment option was to build a water treatment plant for each town at existing Water Corporation sites.

How will the new water treatment plants work?

A desalination process called Electro Dialysis Reversal (EDR) will be used at the four water treatment plants. EDR technology has been successfully used in regional towns across Australia to improve water quality conditions, reduce nitrate levels and convert over 90% of the treated water into drinking water. It is currently used at the Wiluna and Yalgoo water treatment plants in the Murchison region.

August 2018 update

We are pleased to advise our authorised contractor for this project is Guidera O'Connor. We will now work with Guidera O'Connor to progress the design of the four treatment plants and expect to begin construction of the first plant in mid 2019.

Delivery schedule

We will build each water treatment plant in stages, starting in Mount Magnet in mid 2019 and progressing to Cue, Sandstone and Meekatharra. At this stage, we expect all plants to be operational by mid/late 2020.

This schedule has been determined by each town's specific plant requirements and available power supply.

How will the water treatment plants be powered?

Existing Water Corporation assets on the water treatment plant sites will continue to operate using grid power.

As part of our commitment to improved sustainability, solar power and batteries will be installed at all four sites to minimise the amount of additional grid power required to run the new water treatment plants.

While Mount Magnet has sufficient power available to run the new plant, additional solar and battery power is required to operate the EDR technology at the Cue, Sandstone and Meekatharra water treatment plants.

A diesel generator will also be installed at the Cue, Meekatharra and Sandstone sites for additional power support. Sandstone will also receive two new 200kL water storage tanks and a booster pump station to improve their water storage.
