## From The CEO

After spending a week in Canberra at the Australian Local Government Association National General Assembly, and then three weeks in Tasmania on holiday, it is quite pleasing to be back in Cue where at least the day time temperature is far more comfortable.

At a special Council meeting held on 22 July, Council set the rate in the dollar for all categories of rateable properties within the Shire. Due to the requirements of the *Local Government Act 1995*, the Differential Rates set must be approved by the Minister for Local Government. Once approval has been granted, the 2019/20 financial year budget will be finalised for adoption by Council. Rate notices will be sent out shortly after.

One of the major projects the Shire is currently planning for in the budget process is the construction of unassisted living facilities for older residents in the community. The current proposal is focused on developing land reserved for Shire purposes on the corner of Robinson and Dowley Streets to enable the construction of six two bedroom units, with allowance for future expansion as the need arises. This project will rely heavily on funding from external sources, such as government grants, and is therefore unlikely to be achieved in the short term, however having plans in place will put the Shire in a position to take advantage of funding opportunities that arise in the future.

The Shire has been successful in obtaining grant funds through the Community Sports and Recreation Facilities Fund to assist with the construction of a small wheels park in the currently unused cricket pitch area adjacent to the basketball courts. The main component of the park will be a Parkitect modular pump track designed for scooters, skateboards and small bicycles. Unfortunately, this type of track is manufactured internationally and will take fourteen weeks to deliver, meaning that this project will not be completed until much later in the year.





The basketball and tennis courts will soon receive some much needed attention, with a contractor engaged to repair cracks in the base, re-apply a rubberised paint surface and renew the court markings. Investigations are also underway into suitable LED replacements for the existing lighting to reduce running costs. The courts are currently lit between 7pm and 9pm daily. If you are interested in using the courts outside of these hours and require lights on, please contact the Shire office.

Local Government elections are due to be held on 19 October this year, with four of the seven Cue Councillor positions becoming vacant. Nominations will open on 5 September and remain open for one week. If you have ever thought about nominating to become a Councillor, but weren't sure if the role was for you, the WA Local Government Association will be running a free webinar for prospective elected members on Thursday, 15 August from 5pm to 6pm. This Webinar focuses on the following key areas:

Parliament's role in creating legislation for Local Government; how to read the Local Government Act 1995 and Regulations; who does what at a Local Government; a Councillor's personal responsibilities; and consequences of improper conduct.

Participants will have the opportunity to ask questions during the Q&A Session at the end of the presentation. The webinar will be recorded and made available to the public within a few days of the event. For further information and to register, visit www.walga.asn.au/Training/Our-Services/Webinars. Be quick to register as places will fill fast.

On 28 August, the Variety WA Bash will be visiting Cue on their route through the Gascoyne and Murchison regions. Participants will enjoy an overnight stay at Nallan Station and community provided recovery breakfast. The bash will raise funds for children's charity, Variety. Keep an eye out for the uniquely decorated cars which are all classics at least thirty years old.

With preparations well under way for filming of the World War 1 movie *Before Dawn*, Prince-Wright Productions have announced opportunities to be involved, whether through sponsorship, purchase of limited edition fan packages or even appearing in the film as an extra. # Easy Lamb sausage caponata stew


#### INGREDIENTS

- 1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 6 (500g) thick lamb sausages
- 1 eggplant, cut into 1.5cm pieces
- 1 red capsicum, cut into 1.5cm pieces
- 2 celery stalks, cut into 1.5cm pieces
- 1 brown onion, finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1 teaspoon fennel seeds, crushed
- 1/4 cup tomato paste
- 2 x 400g cans diced tomatoes
- 2 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- 1 tablespoon drained baby capers
- 1/4 cup small fresh basil leaves
- 1/2 x 480g sourdough garlic bread, warmed, to serve

#### **METHOD**

- Heat 1 tablespoon oil in a large, deep frying pan over high heat. Cook sausages, turning, for 5 minutes or until browned. Transfer to a board. Thinly slice
- Heat remaining oil in same pan over medium-high heat. Add eggplant, capsicum, celery and onion. Cook, stirring, for 10 minutes or until eggplant is almost tender. Add garlic and fennel seeds. Cook, stirring, for 1 minute or until fragrant
- Add paste, tomatoes and 1 cup cold water. Bring to the boil. Return sausage to pan. Reduce heat to low. Simmer for 10 minutes or until sauce thickens and sausage is cooked through. Stir in vinegar and capers. Sprinkle with basil leaves. Serve with garlic bread.



#### **Integrated Chronic Disease Care (ICDC)**

Is aimed at vulnerable/disadvantaged populations, including those in remote areas suffering from chronic disease including and focusing on diabetes, cardiovascular or respiratory conditions.

It is a fully subsidised allied health service available to Aboriginal & Non-Aboriginal people with 1 of the 3 Chronic Disease in Geraldton and remote areas who fit the criteria. Health professionals travel to remote areas to coordinate care and support patients to manage their chronic conditions better. Teams will also coordinate and link patients to relevant services.

#### CRITERIA:

- Has either Diabetes, Respiratory or Cardiac issues
- Current concession card required if patient resides less than 100km from Geraldton
- Current Care Plan

#### Care Coordination is:


