# FROM THE CEO

Recent rains resulting from cyclone activity in the North of the state were a pleasant relief from the hot weather. While the rain is welcome, when it comes down in a heavy cloudburst, or flows downstream in a rush, it can cause a great deal of damage to our road network. Care should be taken on all roads throughout the Shire, particularly at floodways, as the road crew works their way through repairs. Contractors will also be addressing damage from an earlier rain event, which was declared a natural disaster, with funding from the Federal Government. Please keep in mind that workers and machinery may be encountered on any of the Shire's roads at this time and observe speed limits and traffic directions posted through road works.

Rain and warm weather also mean prime mosquito breeding conditions. The fogger will be out intermittently, when conditions are suitable, just before dusk to control their numbers.

A production crew will be in Cue over the long weekend, filming material for a new television series called Outback Car Hunters. The show follows car fanatics GT and Dave on a road trip across Western Australia as they search for classic cars, bikes, tractors & motoring memorabilia to buy and restore. The show has been commissioned for the UK Discovery Channel and will be broadcast to an estimated audience of 40 million people in the UK, Ireland and Australia.

A small herd of cattle has been hanging around town for several weeks, venturing into the centre of town after dark, with several reports being received of animals grazing on residential lawns. Arrangements were made with local pastoralists for the herd to be rounded up into a mobile stock yard and collected.

Construction and sealing of a section of Wilgie Mia Road to the entry point of Fenix Resources' Iron Ridge mine in the Weld Range is nearing completion, with only guideposts and signage to be installed. The quality of the road, being specifically constructed to cater for vehicles carting massive tonnages, is a credit to the Shire's road crew. During planning for this project, it was discovered that the first portion of the road had been incorrectly referred to as Beebyn-Karbar Road. The road has now been resurveyed and placed on its correct alignment, with Wilgie Mia Road officially commencing at the junction with Beringarra-Cue Road. Beebyn-Karbar Road now turns off Wilgie Mia Road after several kilometres. Care should be taken while all road users become familiar with the new layout. The entire project is being funded by Fenix.

Westgold are advancing their plans for the sealing of Big Bell-Wyah Pool Road, Beringarra-Cue Road, Miners Pass Road and Cue-Wondinong Road in accordance with a Memorandum of Understanding with the Shire. Substantial progress has also been made on a project to install sealed turning nodes at each end of the Cue Aerodrome to accommodate the turning circle of larger jets for Westgold's workforce transport needs. Westgold have engaged Griffin Civil to perform the construction work, which is expected to commence on 19 March.

The Shire has purchased a second hand road sweeper to replace the current, much smaller, machine which is not particularly suited to the task. The sweeper is currently in biosecurity quarantine while it awaits cleaning. Unfortunately, the quarantine facility has a large backlog

of plant to be processed and our sweeper has been stuck in the queue for quite some time. Hopefully the machine will soon be in action tidying up the town streets.

All streets within the Cue townsite will soon be resurfaced with an asphalt slurry seal which will extend the life of the network and provide a much smoother surface. The Shire has engaged Downer EDI to undertake the works, which are expected to commence after Easter.

Janet Wicks has resigned from her position as the Shire's Project Officer and intends to relocate to Tasmania. Janet has been instrumental in planning and delivering current and future major projects that will benefit the Cue community for many years to come and I would like to acknowledge her contribution to the betterment of life in Cue.

We will be enjoying a morning tea and outdoor play with the students. We will then play in the classroom, sing nursery rhymes & read a story.



When EKPS asked the community for donations of Acrylic paint, Robin was more than happy to drop in and make a donation to the the EKPS Community Group.




#### BACK TO SCHOOL

In 2017 Robin asked KCGM for some volunteers to assist him in the clean up of Boulder Camp,




#### KALGOORLIE MRI MACHINE


