The Shire of Cue, Local Government Election was held by postal vote on 16 October 2021. Around sixteen people turned out at the Council chambers for the count on the evening. It was an interesting result with there being a tie for third place. This resulted in the final position being drawn by ballot with Ian Dennis being re-elected as Councillor. The results from the Western Australian Electoral Commission are provided below.

Congratulations to returning Councillors Liz Houghton and Ian Dennis and welcome to new Councillor Julie Humphreys.

A number of Councillors and myself attended the Cue Police Station flag raising ceremony on Monday 11 October and enjoyed a sausage sizzle afterwards to welcome the new Police Sergeant Mark Williams to town. The event was well attended with over fifty people coming along including students from Cue Primary School who assisted to raise the flags.

The Shire working in conjunction with the Department of Fire and Emergency Services have cut a number of fire breaks around the Cue town site and undertaken fire mitigation works within the town site. Owners and occupiers of land are reminded of their obligations to clear and maintain fire breaks over the summer months.

Officers from Landgate visited Cue on 19 October to undertake the revaluation on Gross Rental Value (GRV) on all rateable properties in the Shire of Cue. GRVs form the basis of local council rates and Department of Fire and Emergency Services levies. The new GRVs will come into effect from 1 July 2022.

The Murdoch University Vet Program was held on Monday 18 October at the Shire Hall. Students from the university provided free pet checks and sterilisation under the guidance of a senior vet. Other services available included microchipping and vaccination. Around thirty animals were seen on the day and the program was a great success.

Road works are still in progress on Beringarra Road near Glen Station. The sections of road undergoing reconstruction are expected to be sealed from 5 November 2021. For your own safety and the safety of the workers, please obey all traffic control signs when passing through roadworks.

Halloween was a fun filled evening of costumes, art and craft activities, food and refreshments thanks to the great work of the Shire's Youth Coordinators, Sydney and Caris and grant funding provided by Healthway, Lotterywest and the Department of Communities through Meerilinga. Around 20 kids and 20 adults attended the town hall for the evening and enjoyed a trunk or treat opportunity in the car park provided by members of the Cue community.

The next ordinary Council meeting will be held at 6:30pm on Tuesday 16 November 2021.

Change in Priority

Lakeside Rd / Miners Pass Shire of Cue

Main Roads WA on behalf of the Shire of Cue has agreed to change the existing Stop sign control to Give Way control from Miners Pass to Lakeside Rd at the intersection of Miners Pass and Lakeside Rd, Cue on 24th of November 2021.

Motorists in Lakeside Rd will be required to give way to all traffic on Miners Pass. The changeover will be carried out over a two week period with Give Way signs displayed on all four approaches.

The change will improve traffic flow and increase road traffic safety at this intersection.

Motorists are reminded to take particular care at a four way Give Way sign controlled intersection and give way to their right as per the Road Traffic Code 2000.



RESILIENCE: RESPECT: RESPONSIBILITY

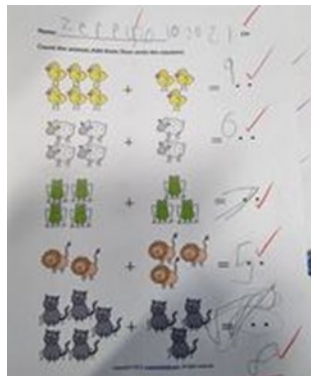

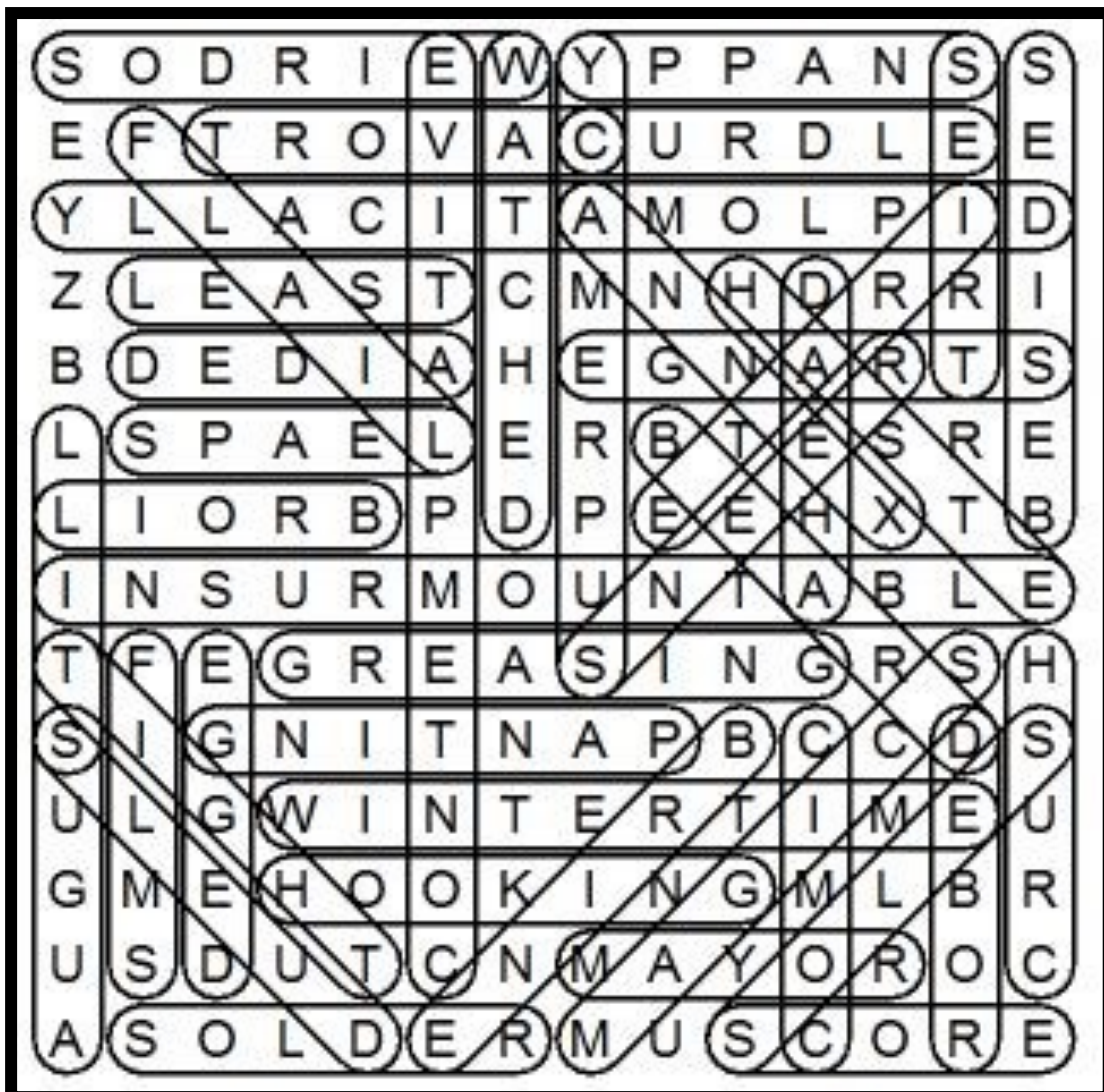
