Please don't forget that there is a public holiday on Monday the 6th of March, as such the CRC will be closed.













FROM THE CEO

The Shire has finalised the transfer of the Masonic Lodge back into Shire ownership. We have engaged Heritage Architects who have done a site visit to ensure the restoration program is consistent with the historic value. Works will commence soon to restore the building and repurpose it into a useable space.

At the February 2023 council meeting it was agreed to negotiate and enter into a lease agreement with Cockles Pty Ltd for the leasing of shop space on the main street. It is planned to move the Cuerosity Shoppe to the new location and the Shire is in the planning stage of opening a Community Gym.

Council adopted the Annual Report for 2021 - 2022 at the February meeting and have set the date for the annual meeting of Electors for 21 March 2023. Public notices have been distributed and included in this edition of the Dryblower.

Council has resolved to undertake the 2023 Local Government Election by postal vote and have engaged the WA Electoral Commission to facilitate the election.

On Friday night 24 February India Bradshaw played live music in the garden at the Murchison Club Hotel. The crowd enjoyed an ambient night with fabulous weather and the sounds of her angelic voice, combined with her guitar, echoing throughout the gardens.



The first twilight markets for 2023, were held on Saturday 25 February at the Community Resource Centre and included a great range of local store holders together with food and refreshments available. The markets were enjoyed by lots of locals and again the weather was ideal. The next markets will be held Sunday 26 March 2023 from 9.30am.



The Shire of Cue has engaged the services of Brad Bell to start as our mechanic mid March. Brad comes with extensive experience working on a wide range of machinery.

Maurice Walsh has been contracted as our new Environmental Health Officer. Maurice attended Cue in February and will continue monthly visits going forward.

An update regarding the Cue Nursing Post. We currently have Sally as a temporary nurse based in Cue until June 2023. WACHS is currently undertaking the recruitment process for a permanent placement.

We have been experiencing a number of mini storms in the last month so just a reminder to ensure any loose items around your yards are secured. Arrangements to have any larger items removed can be made by contacting the Manager of Works and Services at the Shire.

Due to mechanical problems our mosquito fogging operations are temporarily on hold. A new fogging machine has been ordered and we hope to take delivery in the coming weeks. Operations will commence again soon, this can include mornings or evenings to take advantage of wind conditions. Residents are asked to check their properties and remove any potential mosquito breeding areas, by emptying containers holding water, ensuring gutters are not holding water and checking yards for areas that hold water.

Country Stargazing

The Equinox & Star Clusters

The equinox marks the transition from summer to autumn in the southern hemisphere and has almost the same number of hours of daylight as darkness!

Equinoxes happen twice a year and on the dates of the equinox, the Sun is exactly above the Earth's equator, causing the equal length of night and day. The equinox marks several astronomical phenomena too! During the equinox, the Sun will rise directly in the east and set due west. The Sun will also appear exactly halfway between its northern most and southern most location in the sky. The exact time of the equinox occurs when the sun is directly above the Earth's equator, for 2023 this will occur at 5:24am for West Australians.

The Autumnal equinox for the southern hemisphere will occur on the 21st of March.

For some fun stargazing, the quarter Moon makes a close approach to Mars from March 26, and on the 28th will be just below the red planet. For those with telescopes or high-powered binoculars, the Shoe-Buckle Star cluster can be seen above Mars, and the January Salt-and-Pepper Star Cluster can be seen below the Moon.

When to look: 7pm to 9.30pm, 28th of March. Which direction to look: In the western sky.

Something Interesting: Star clusters are lovely astronomical objects to view, often distinguishable with special shapes and patterns. The Shoe-Buckle Cluster is an open cluster located in the constellation Gemini. The cluster is approximately 2,800 light-years away from Earth and contains approximately 200 stars.

We will have more stargazing tips and helpful hints throughout the year so keep looking up and marvel at our clear, dark skies.




