The CHC has recently taken delivery of an Electrolux kerosene fridge and a generator with diesel engine.

The Ronaldson Tippet 6.5hp diesel engine was used to power the attached generator. This engine was invented in 1930 in Ballarat to work the gold rushes in Victoria. It is eerily relevant that it was also used during goldmining in Cue in later years.

It is a very rare piece of Australian-made machinery and even more rare to find one in WA, let alone Cue. Many thanks are extended to Westgold for their efforts to collect, store and deliver this machinery to the CHC. A lot of work was carried out by Ray, Jono, Kevin, Bob, Ben and Dylan from Westgold to ensure it arrived safely.

Thanks also to Marc for acquiring and delivering the fridge and to Phil and Norm for assisting with unloading of them. Some other small but vital tasks and movement of items were also carried out in the CHC building by our volunteer helpers.

FROM THE CEO

It is a great time of year here in Cue. The cooler weather is a welcome relief and it is always great to see the familiar faces of returning visitors that are here for our tourist season. Welcome to all travellers, visitors and old friends. I hope you enjoy your time here and everything Cue has to offer.

The Shire has experienced a rain event in late March and early April that saw some flooding across, and damage to Shire roads. A number of Shire roads are waiting on repairs to damage caused by this. Road users are asked to take care when travelling, particularly at flood crossings. Please drive to the road conditions and observe any traffic directions. Road Condition Reports are available on the Shire of Cue's website cue.wa.gov.au and also our Facebook page. On the positive side, the rain will hopefully bring some benefits to pastoralists and increase the potential for an impressive wildflower display for our visitors.

The ANZAC Day memorial service held at Arthur Stanley Gurney Memorial Park was well attended with over a hundred people up early for the dawn service. This was followed by about half of the attendees joining us for breakfast at the Queen of the Murchison.

The Cuerosity Shoppe is in the process of relocating back to the Murchison Traders building at 59 Austin St. The Senior Citizens group is doing a great job of cleaning the premises and getting it ready to re-open. The Shire has entered into a lease agreement with the owners of the building to house the Cuerosity Shoppe and utilise part of the space for the purpose of a community gymnasium. It will be great to see this part of the main Street re-activated for the community.

Mosquito fogging will be carried out intermittently, when conditions are suitable. This is usually just before dusk but can also include early morning, to control their numbers.
