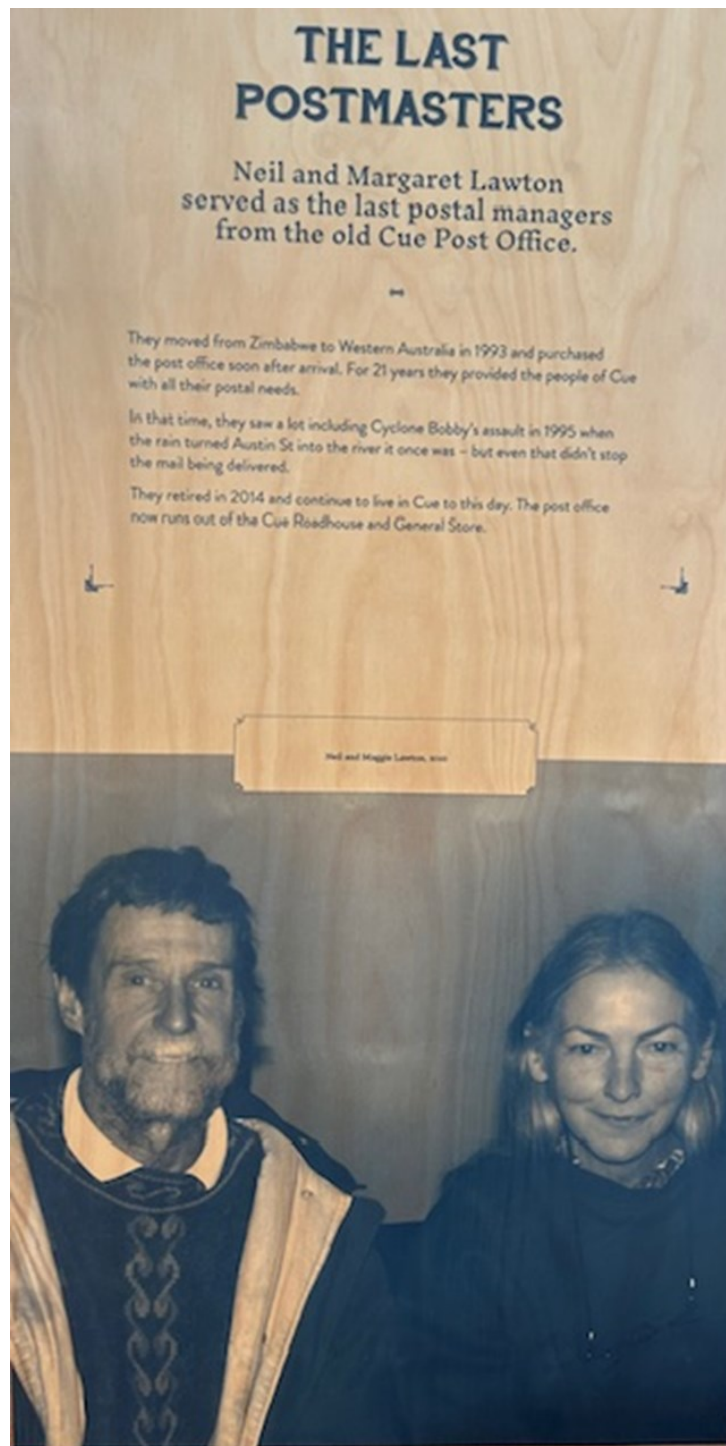
Everyone walked away smiling and wishing the concert was longer.

Harry Casey the Captain of the Cue Volunteer Fire and Rescue was nominated for the 2024 Western Australia Fire Emergency Services Volunteer Fire and Rescue Service Individual Achievement Award. Harry is a tireless volunteer for the Cue Community, and we congratulate him on his nomination.



I had a meeting with Liz Jones General Manager of Ramelius Resources with regards to their Moyagee Project. They have opened a number of pits for open cut mining and the ore is being transported to their processing plant in Mt Magnet.

The Shire has completed another section of shared paths on Wittenoom Street and Railway Street thanks to a WA Bicycle Network Grant. This is just another step in ensuring safer passage for small wheels and pedestrians traversing our town.

Flood damage contracts have been awarded to Lacy Bros and Jason Homewood for repairs, caused by flooding in 2022 and 2023, to numerous roads in the Shire.

Westgold Resources have increased their flight schedules to four return flights a week on Monday, 2 flights on Wednesday and Thursday at the Cue Aerodrome. All of these flights are on the Dash 8 Q400 Turbo Prop plane.

On Saturday 7 September we had the Stargazing event at the Cue Town Oval. There was over 80 people who enjoyed a night of under the stars and entertainment provided by Asher-Rose and Brenton. Attendees were able to enjoy a guided tour of the night sky with the Astronomers showing us, via a laser beam, the various constellations and our solar system. This was followed up by being able to view the moon, planets and clusters and other gems in the sky through various telescopes set up for the night sky. I would like to thank the Shire staff for their efforts in transforming the marquee into a celestial wonderland, Murchison Club Hotel for the exceptional food and for the people who attended.



Australian Baroque Four Seasons Vivaldi was performed at the Shire Hall on Wednesday 18 September. Over 40 attendees enjoyed the reverberating sounds of baroque instruments being played under the masterful direction of Artistic Director and violinist Helen Kruger. Each concerto of The Four Seasons was prefaced by a reading of a sonnet which informs the audience of the next performance.



The WA Planning Commission (WAPC) has reviewed the Shire of Cue Local Planning Scheme No.2. The Scheme review report and the WAPC decision letter are available for perusal on the Shire's website or a copy can be viewed at the Shire Admin Office.

Dog owners are reminded of their obligations to keep their dogs contained within the boundaries of their property or on a leash while walking. Please be considerate of others as it can be quite confronting to be approached by an unknown dog while out walking. Just a reminder to everyone, the Shire Ranger visits the area frequently and will act against unrestrained dogs in public places, which may result in a financial penalty to the owner. The only authorised area within the townsite where dogs are permitted to be exercised off-leash is the town oval.

Mosquito fogging is being carried out regularly this past week. It will occur when conditions are suitable which is usually around dusk but can be early morning.

**WESTERN AUSTRALIAN ELECTRICITY SUBSIDY**

Thank you for your email of 10 May 2024 to Hon Rita Saffioti MLA, the Treasurer, regarding the availability of the electricity credit for households and small businesses and that are under an off-grid electricity supply arrangement. The Treasurer has asked me to respond on her behalf.

As you have indicated, to date the Household and Small Business Electricity Credit payments that have been delivered by the Western Australian Government have been directed to customers with a connection to the Western Power and Horizon Power electricity networks as they have focussed on relief from electricity costs.

I appreciate the concerns you have raised and understand that broader cost of living pressures impacting Western Australians. In response to your feedback, the State Government has decided to make the 2024-25 Household Electricity Credit available to eligible off-grid residential households.

Eligible off-grid residential households include dwellings approved to be used as a place of residence that are not connected to the Western Power or Horizon Power electricity networks but have established infrastructure to generate their own electricity (for example, electricity generators, wind turbines and solar panels).

Applicants under an off-grid supply arrangement are required to demonstrate proof of permanent residence and confirmation that a payment by an electricity retailer has not been received. Applicants are also required to provide evidence of incurred costs to generate electricity, such as generator system installation or maintenance costs, or purchase of fuel supplies for electricity generation.

# Council News

---

Hi 'Dryblower' Readers,

As we head on towards Christmas, Council has been busy finalising a number of important matters currently on the Administration agenda.

The Administration and Council held a workshop on 10<sup>th</sup> September to review the Shire Policy Manual and consider any new and proposed updates to existing policies. Council approved the updated policies where necessary at its meeting on 17<sup>th</sup> September to ensure it remains contemporary and relevant to the Shire's operations. The Policy Manual update will be available on the Shire website for your review.

On Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> September I attended the Environment Policy Team Meeting held at the Western Australian Local Government Association ('WALGA') office in West Leederville. The focus of the meeting was on Energy Transition, Renewable Energy, Planning Reforms, Priority Agriculture, Native Vegetation Clearing Permits and the National Biosecurity Strategy. The Environment Team also considered the commonwealth and State Governments National Water Initiative to ensure sustainable water planning, changing climate, water security, trading water rights and water storage and delivery.

On 3<sup>rd</sup> September the CEO and I, along with representatives from many Band 4 Local Governments across the State, attended a meeting in Perth with the Hon. Hannah Beasley MLA Minister for Local Government and Youth, and the Minister Assisting the Minister for Training and Workforce Development and representatives from the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries.

The meeting was seen as an opportunity to explore the many issues facing smaller Local Governments across Western Australia. The Minister was open to listening to the concerns of Shires like Cue and proposed a further workshop meeting to consider the most critical of small Local Government needs some of which include:-

- Renewable Energy Policy Framework
- The provision of medical services
- Housing
- Regional Subsidiaries
- ICT systems and software requirements
- Alternative income streams (Caravan parks and light industrial areas)
- Waste Management Funding
- Asbestos management
- Financial Assistance Grants
- Emergency response
- Audit Fees

The significant issues for Cue will include health, housing, trade skills shortage, staff retention, financial assistance but to name a few. The unfortunate reality facing all smaller Local Governments is that population and political influence do play a role when major projects, the provision of essential services, grants and other funding are being considered by Government. We, as a Shire, are always at the forefront of ensuring Governments of all persuasions are aware of our needs and remind policy makers and the legislators that small shouldn't mean that we are to be ignored!

WALGA held its State Council Meeting on 4<sup>th</sup> September and is currently looking at proposed amendments to the Local Government Act which are currently before the WA Parliament. These amendments will impact all Local Governments. State Councillors were provided with an update on the Legislative Reforms. Perth Lord Mayor, Basil Zempilas, attended the meeting and gave a presentation on the activities happening in the City of Perth.

The monthly Shire Forum was held on 10<sup>th</sup> September where the CEO, Richard Towell and Works Manager, John Curtin provided an overview of the Shire activities during the month. Council is pleased the work on the gym is nearing an end and work on the addition to the WA Bank is well underway. Council is looking forward to the next project – rejuvenating the Cue Masonic Lodge No. 22

The monthly Shire meeting was held on 17<sup>th</sup> September and Councillors considered a comprehensive agenda. A copy of the agenda can be found on the Shire website. Please access using the following link.

Readers will note that Council approved the meeting dates for 2025 and are most welcome to attend and be part of the Council meeting process.

Councillors Ian Dennis, Julie Humphreys and I attended the Pre-opening of the new 24/7 Cue Gym on 24<sup>th</sup> September. This is a great asset to the town and a lot of the credit must go to David, our carpenter and Matt, our resident plumber for their efforts. The gym is colourful and complete with quality equipment. Council was very supportive of this project initiative and welcomes all new members to use the gym. Applications for membership can be obtained from the Shire Office.



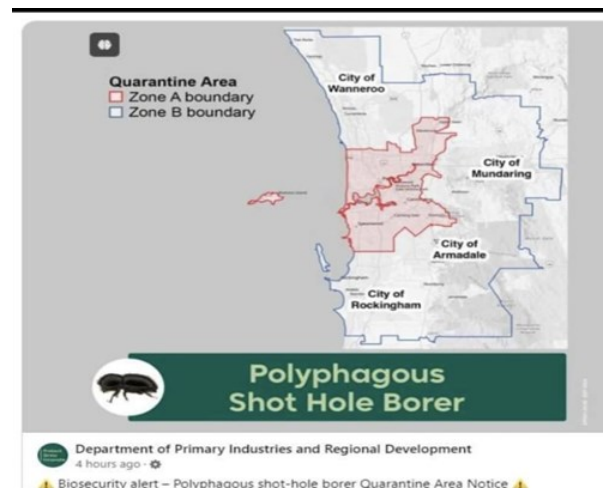




On a final note, the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development ('DPIRD') and WALGA have asked all travellers and residents (particularly those from the metropolitan area) to be on the lookout out for the infamous Polyphagous Shothole Borer which has now spread across an extensive part of the metropolitan area.



I have mentioned the exotic beetle in my last 'Dryblower' report and since that time the problem has spread even further. The beetle is restricted to WA however; its biosecurity impact is such that a national committee has been formed to consider the problem and how to deal with it before it spreads across borders. Travellers are asked not to transfer firewood, tree branches, and other green waste out of the zone areas shown on the map below. The agricultural regions are vulnerable, and we are asked not to transfer tree product so as to mitigate the risk of spreading the problem. The beetle attacks more than 400 tree species, including crops such as apple, avocado, macadamia and mango. Trees grown for timber, such as ash, elms and oaks are also at serious risk.

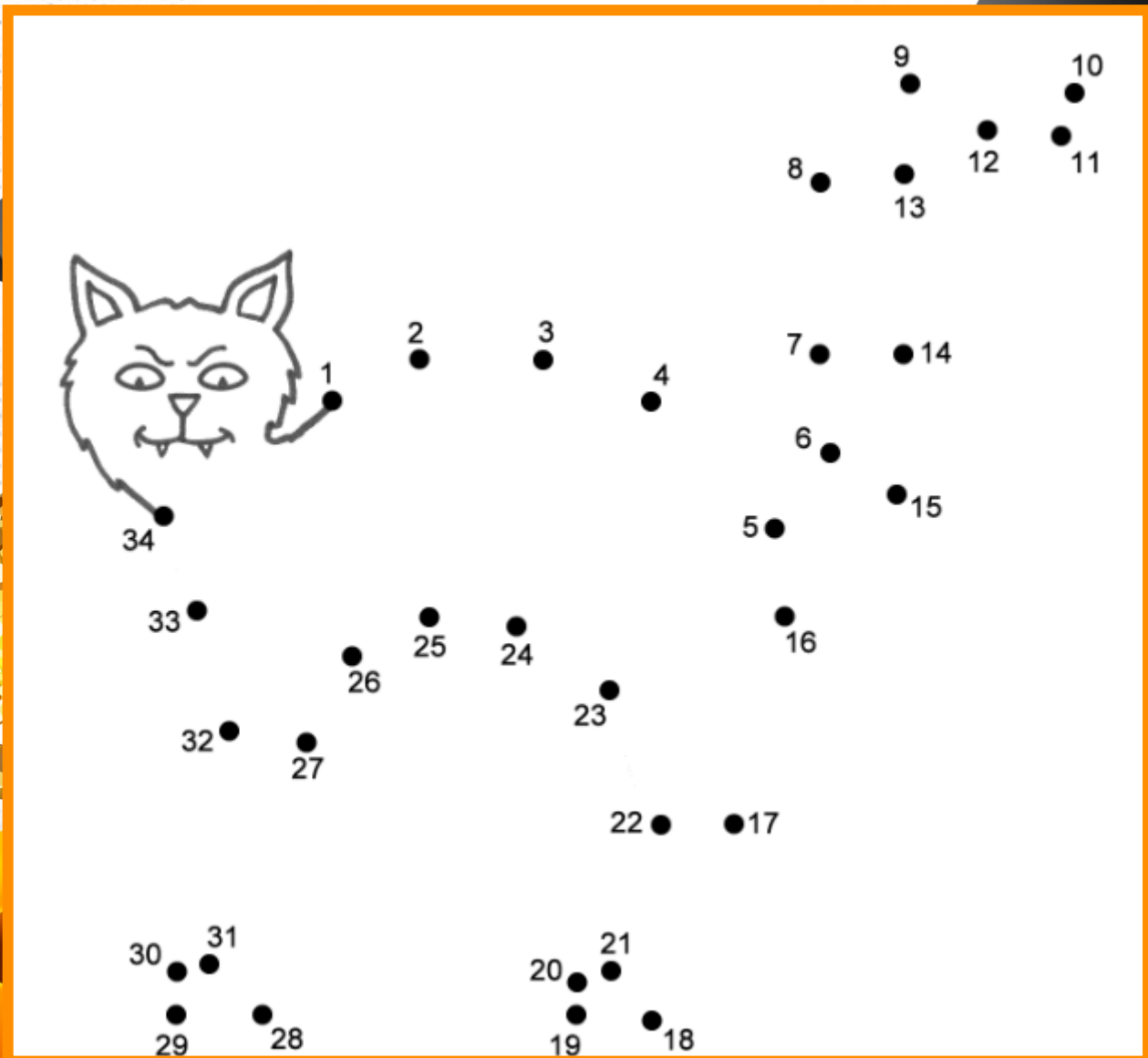
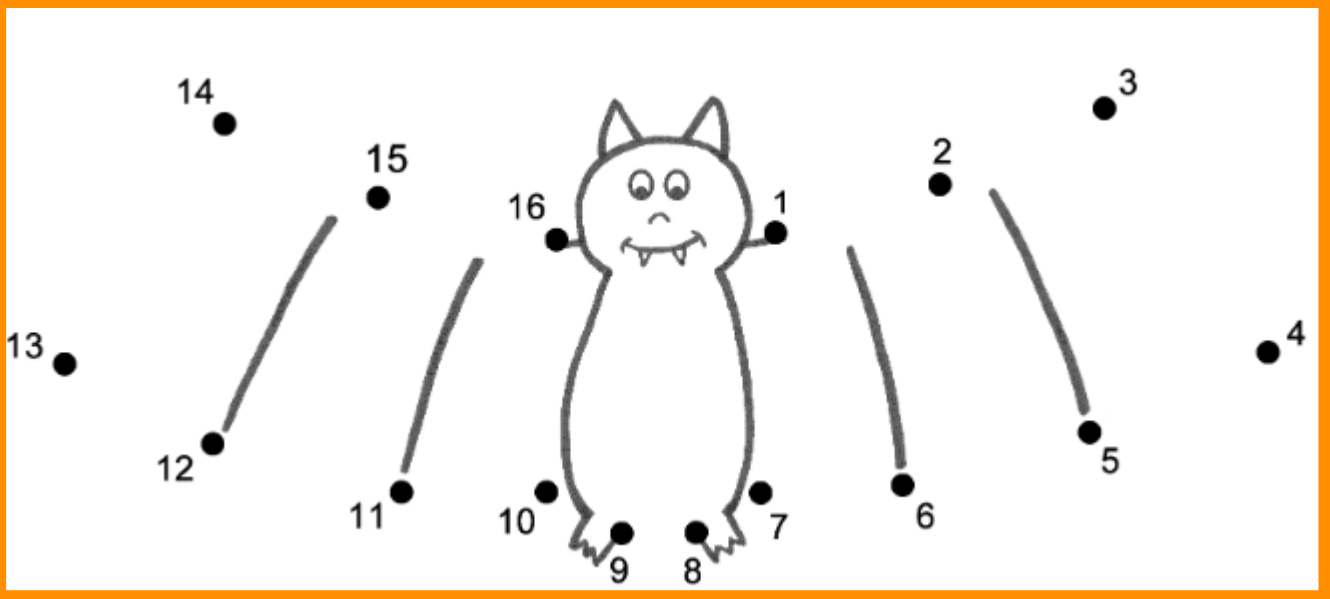

# SHIRE OF CUE FIRE RESTRICTIONS

## Prohibited Burning Period

15th December to 31st March

**STRICTLY NO BURNING**

## Restricted Burning Period

1st October to 30th April

**PERMITS ARE REQUIRED**

Firebreaks should be maintained for the whole of the restricted period.





# SHIRE OF CUE FIRE RESTRICTIONS

## TOWNSITES

On or before 1st October all town lots within the town sites of Cue and Tuckanarra are required to be treated as follows;

Where the area of land is less than 3,000m<sup>2</sup>, the property must be cleared, mowed, slashed to a MAXIMUM height of 7.5 cm of all flammable material.

Where the area of the land is 3,000m<sup>2</sup> or more, a firebreak must be provided not less than 3 metres in width inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the properties owned or occupied and all flammable material must be cleared a distance of 2.7m from all buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land and maintained free of such material until the 30th April.

## FUEL STORAGE AREAS

On or before the 1st October all grass and similar material is to be cleared from such places where drum ramps are located and where drums, empty or full, are stored and such areas to be maintained cleared of grass and similar flammable material.

## FARM BUILDINGS AND UNATTENDED ELECTRIC MOTORS AND HAY STACKS

Fire breaks at least 3 metres in width completely surrounding and not more than 20 metres from the perimeter of any building, group of buildings or haystacks, All flammable material must be removed from an area 2.7 metres in width immediately surrounding the building. All flammable material must be removed from an area 3 metres in width immediately surrounding an unattended electric motor site.

## UNATTENDED FUEL OPERATED MOTORS

All flammable material must be removed from an area 3 metres in width immediately surrounding an unattended fuel operated motor whether the motor is intended to be used or not.

## RURAL LAND

Firebreaks must be provided not less than 3 meters in width inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the properties owned or occupied: where this is not practicable the firebreaks must be provided as near as possible to, and within, such boundaries.

## BARBEQUES AND INCINERATORS

Gas and electric barbeques are permitted any time. Solid fuel barbeques and incinerators are PROHIBITED on days of VERY HIGH FIRE DANGER or above.

## PENALTY

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of up to \$5,000 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work in this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or Occupier by the date required by this notice.
