# From the CEO

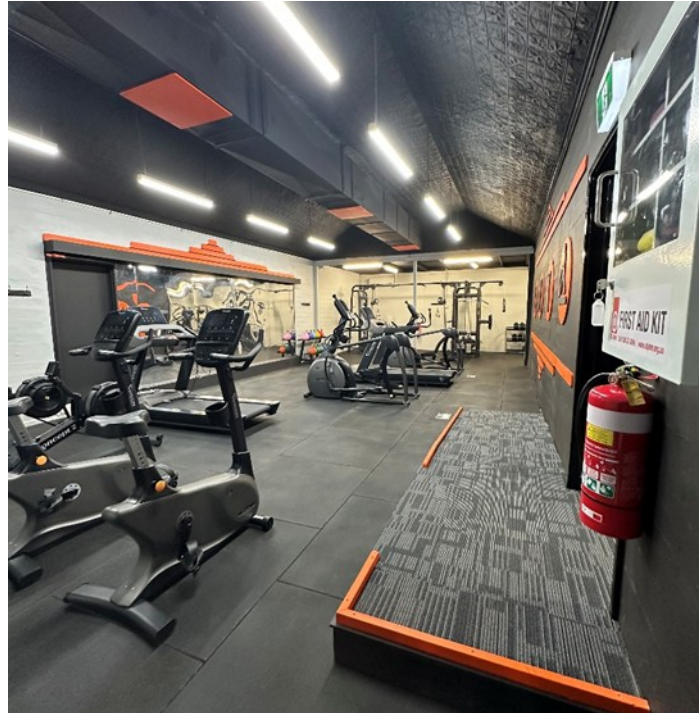
The Federal Election is taking place on Saturday 3 May 2025. Voting on the day will be available at the Cue Shire Hall. Polling will be open from 8.00am to 6.00pm. Other voting options are available at the Australian Electoral Commission website, [https://www.aec.gov.au/voting/ways\\_to\\_vote/](https://www.aec.gov.au/voting/ways_to_vote/).

The ANZAC Day memorial service held at Arthur Stanley Memorial Park was well attended with well over a hundred and twenty-five people up early for the dawn service. The Murchison Club Hotel provided a lovely, cooked breakfast with over eighty people enjoying the food and social atmosphere. The students from Cue Primary School made a beautiful mural that was laid at the memorial. The mural depicts the dawn which honors the landing at Gallipoli and poppies for remembering them. I would like to thank all the students for their efforts in creating this stunning artwork.



Wayne Bramwell, Managing Director of Westgold Resources Limited provided a community update on 14 April 2025. Wayne and the Westgold team gave an overview of Westgold's operations in and around Cue and answered any questions from the community members in attendance. The main topics from the community centered around whether Westgold would consider allowing visitors to access Westgold leases for prospecting and the future relocation of the Great Fingal Mine Office.

Please be considerate of others as it can be quite confronting to be approached by an unknown dog while out walking. The Shire Ranger visits the area frequently and will take action against unrestrained dogs in public places. The only authorised area within the townsite where dogs are permitted to be exercised off-leash is the town oval. It is your responsibility to control and look after your pets.

Mosquito fogging will be carried out intermittently, when conditions are suitable. This is usually just before dusk but can also include early morning, to control their numbers.

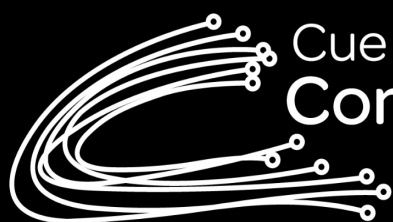
