From the CEO

The Shire continues the opening of a number of historic buildings at regular times to allow tourists and travellers the opportunity to see inside these iconic places. The Railway building, Bank building and Masonic Lodge building are now open at regular times for public viewing. Check out the Shire notice boards or visitors centre for opening times.

On Thursday 19 June 2025 the Shire in conjunction with Craig from XL2 held a quiz night at the Shire Hall as a fundraiser for the Variety Bash. It was a vibrant night with about 60 people vying for some fabulous prizes. We would like to thank everyone who came along and made the night such a success. Also a big thank you to my staff who made the hall look great and ensured everything ran smoothly on the night.

The Carey Right Track Foundation are attending Cue on a fortnightly basis to provide programs at the Cue Primary School and after-school activities at the Youth Centre. This initiative is a collaboration between Westgold Resources, Cue Primary School and the Shire of Cue.

In the last week of June a group from the Shire of Cue and other representatives from Murchison shire's, flew over to Canberra to represent at the Australian Local Government Association convention. It was a non stop week of activity. The week started with the Regional Cooperation and Development Forum which addressed disaster resilience, safer regional roads, mental health in regional communities and the State of the Regions by Bernard Salt AM. The main conference was across two days, and the week finishing with the Ministerial engagement forum. Numerous presenters spoke on the theme of National priorities need local solutions. Her Excellency the Honourable Ms Sam Mostyn AC, Governor General of the Commonwealth of Australia provided a welcome and address along with Federal Minister the Hon Kristy McBain who spoke on a number of topics and occasions. This year we had around 1300 delegates from all around Australia attend, with around 190 motions debated, all focussed on advocating for more funding support for local councils, more funding for roads, housing, infrastructure, our environment, and lots more. Speakers at the conference covered topics including how AI is shaping our future and how this might look, local government jobs and skills, housing and community infrastructure, safer roads, emergency management and leadership in an ever changing climate.

Roadworks are ongoing on the Beringarra - Cue Road with resealing works, guidepost installation and grid replacement work all taking place over the coming months. Road users are reminded to slow down through road work areas and obey all traffic directions. Barefoot bowls is on every Wednesday night from 6.30pm to 8,30pm. Everyone is welcome to attend this free event with all equipment provided.

Dog owners are reminded of their obligations to keep their dogs contained within the boundaries of their property or on a leash while walking. Please be considerate of others as it can be quite confronting to be approached by an unknown dog while out walking. The Shire Ranger visits the area frequently and will take action against unrestrained dogs in public places. The only authorised area within the townsite where dogs are permitted to be exercised off-leash is the town oval. It is your responsibility to control and look after your pets.

Mosquito fogging will be carried out intermittently, when conditions are suitable. This is usually just before dusk but can also include early morning, to control their numbers. 



Council News

Hi 'Dryblower' Readers,

Welcome to the July 2025 edition of the Cue 'Dryblower'.

The 2025/2026 financial year is already underway and if we look back over the last 12 months, we, as a community, have achieved a lot to ensure Cue is a place where people want to work and live and tourists want to visit.

Your Council has worked closely with the Administration over that time to deliver on the Shire's Corporate Business Plan in line with the 2023 to 2038 Strategic Community Plan, which was reviewed at our last Council meeting on 17th June 2025.

A lot of work has gone into developing these plans on behalf of our town so please take the time to review both plans on the Shire's Website. Council is always looking to engage with the Community and have some feedback which we can consider and incorporate into the plans.

Whilst we have achieved much there is still a lot to do. As a Shire we punch above our weight, and it is a testament to those on Council and within the Administration for the high level of achievement. Our audit outcomes are at the highest level and our financial management is responsible and strong.

On 4th June 2025 I attended the Western Australian Local Government Association ('WALGA') State Council Forum. The Forum is informal and provides State Councillors with an update on developments with the Local Government sector and enables Councillors to have input into matters under consideration. The WALGA State Council represents all 139 Local Governments across the State and with a new State and Federal Government it is important that we provide policy and advocacy direction in line with the agenda of both levels of Government. Some areas discussed included:-

- A review of the draft budget for 2025-26.
- A presentation by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development ('DPIRD') on the State's preparedness for the possible arrival of the H5 Bird Flu. The flu is not yet in Australia but with migratory birdlife from across the world being the carriers the State is gearing up for its likely spread into WA.
- The Forum also received a presentation on WALGA's Corporate Governance Charter review currently underway. State Council reviews and updates the Charter to ensure all governance practices continue to be relevant, best practice and fit for purpose.

On 10th June the Shire Council Forum was held at which time the CEO acknowledge the sad passing of Cr Leonie Fitzpatrick, who passed away on Friday 23 May 2025 after a short illness. Leonie made a significant contribution to our Council and will be sadly missed.

- The CEO advised that he had been in contact with the West Australian Electoral Commission ('WAEC') and the Department of Local Government to inform them of the extraordinary vacancy on council as a result of the passing of Cr Fitzpatrick. Notification was received that the vacancy will remain until the next ordinary election in October 2025 at which time elections will be held to fill four (4) vacancies.
- The Shire has opened a number of historic buildings at regular times to allow tourists and travellers the opportunity to see inside these iconic places. The Railway building, Bank building and Masonic Lodge building are now open at regular times for public viewing.
- The Forum received a report from then CEO that the Carey Right Track Foundation are attending Cue on a fortnightly basis to provide programs at the Cue Primary School and after-school activities at the Youth Centre0. This is a great initiative involving the Shire of Cue, Cue Primary School and Westgold Resources Ltd.
- The Forum was provided with an update on the upcoming Australian Local Government Association ('ALGA') National General Assembly to be held on Canberra. This is an important event which will see representatives from Meekatharra, Mount Magnet, Yalgoo and Cue attend to represent our local Shires.

On 11th June I attended the Murchison Regional Vermon Council ('MRVC') meeting in Mt. Magnet. This is an important Council which has the responsibility of controlling wild dogs within its jurisdiction. The Council is comprised of representatives from Sandstone, Yalgoo, Mt. Magnert and Cue.

On 16th June WALGA held a State Council Agenda briefing for Zone Chairs. As one of the outcomes of the recent Performance Evaluation survey and workshop conducted with State Council, WALGA are introducing a new process to support the preparation of Zone Chairs in respect to State Council Agenda items ahead of their respective Zone meetings.

On 17th June 2025 I attended WALG's Selection Committee meeting to determine a number of positions within the framework of Local Government including positions on:-

- WA Biosecurity Council.
- WA Environmental Health Professional Review Board.
- No nominations were received for the position on the Local Health Analytical Authorities Committee

On the evening of 17th June, the Shire held its monthly Council meeting. A number of matters were considered and include:-

- Adopting the review of the Shire of Cue Strategic Community Plan 2023 2038 as presented to the meeting.
- A review of the CEO's Key Performance Indicators for the next financial year.
- Considering the quotes for the provision of supply and spray CRS emulsion for the resealing of Cue Shire roads.

The Australian Local Government Association ('ALGA') held its National General Assembly in Canberra on 24th to 27th June 2025. The Murchison region was well represented with Councillors and Staff from Meekatharra, Mount Magnet, Yalgoo and Cue, along with 122 other delegates from WA attending to share ideas and understand how other Councils are dealing with all matters Local Government. The Assembly combined a Regional Forum where speakers and presenters provided the Assembly with various topics of interest to Local Government.









Various Ministers and Shadow Ministers provided an overview on the direction the Government was taking in the current term. What was obvious was the call from Local Governments across the country for the Federal Government to increase funding to support programs, maintain roads to an acceptable level and improve community standards of living. There was a lot of discussion around ALGA seeking Federal Assistance Grants to 1% of Australia's Gross Domestic Product however; this is unlikely.

June 2025 was a little less hectic than preceding months' activities but nonetheless still a busy time. Readers, please feel free to contact myself or any of the other Councillors if you have a matter you need to bring to the attention of Council and the Administration. Council is always looking to the community to provide input into the future direction of our town.
