## From the CEO

Local Government elections are due to be held on 18 October this year, with three four-year terms and one two-year term of the seven Cue Councillor positions becoming vacant. Nominations will open on Thursday 28 August 2025 and remain open for one week, closing at 4pm on Thursday 4 September 2025. Anyone intending to nominate for election must first complete a free online induction course, provided by the Department of Local Government, Industry Regulation and Safety. The course gives community members a basic understanding of what is required from a council member. The Returning Officer for the election is Stephanie 0473 Wandek. Stephanie can be contacted 032 504 LGro Cue@elections.wa.gov.au if you are interested in nominating.

On 27 August 2025, Council held a budget workshop meeting to discuss the contents of the 2025-2026 Annual Budget and consider upcoming projects. This was followed by a Special Meeting to adopt the 2025-2026 Annual Budget. This includes the rate in the dollar for all categories of rateable properties within the Shire. Ratepayers should expect to receive their rates notices in the first week of September. Ratepayers that pay their rates in full before 17 October 2025 will go into the automatic draw to win one of three cash prizes.

Davyd Hooper and his team are making some great improvements at the Cue Roadhouse. These improvements include a new cool room and cold drinks display (still under construction), changes to the supermarket area allowing better access to the fruit, vegetable and smallgoods. The addition of a seating area at the front of the store is being enjoyed by customers. Well done everyone!









Monday 4 August 2025 Aladdin and his Magic Smartwatch entertained children and adults with an enthralling interactive show. The children were delighted to get invited to participate in role playing on the stage including singing and dancing. Thank you to everyone who attended this function and Shire staff who organised and fed the crowd.



The Murdoch University Vet Program will be in Cue on Friday 24 October 2025. Students from the University will be providing free pet checks and sterilisation under the guidance of a senior veterinarian. Other services available include microchipping and vaccination at the owner's expense. Please note this service is provided by the Shire of Cue and is only for dogs and cats registered with the Shire. Bookings are essential and can be made through the Shire office.

On Sunday 10 August we had the International Centre for Radio Astronomy Research host a Stargazing event. The event was scheduled to be held at the Cue Aerodrome but due to weather conditions was moved to the Cue Shire Hall. There were over 40 people who enjoyed a night of good food and an informative presentation on the Andromeda Galaxy and the Milky Way moving towards each other and the possibility of colliding in around 4.5 billion years. Some great music was provided by Asher-Rose and Brenton. Attendees were able to enjoy viewing the moon, planets and clusters through various telescopes set up for the night sky with brief interruptions from the cloud cover. Thank you to the Shire staff and all involved to make this such an enjoyable event.

#### Mid West Digital Economy Strategy: Engagement Brief

#### Project Overview

The Mid West Development Commission (MWDC or the Commission) is an independent statutory body of the Western Australian State government. The Commission is legislated to encourage, promote, facilitate, and monitor the economic development of the Mid West, which is comprised of three subregions:

Batavia Coast

North Midlands

Murchison

Digital technology, infrastructure, and services are reshaping how we connect as communities, economies, and nations. To help the Mid West Region make the most of these digital opportunities, the Commission are developing a Digital Economy Strategy.

The Strategy aims to strengthen the Region's economy by identifying opportunities to maximise existing digital investments and explore emerging pathways. Achieving this requires understanding regional priorities, strengths, and challenges through practical research and targeted engagement with core regional partners including Traditional Owners, community representatives, businesses, and government.

#### Defining the Digital Economy


The Western Australian Government uses the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) definition for a digital economy, summarised as:

"A digital economy incorporates all economic activity reliant on, or significantly enhanced by the use of digital inputs, including:

- > digital technologies,
- > digital infrastructure.
- > digital services, and
- > data."

The digital economy is supported by three core components:

- Digital society and capability (access to digital technologies and skills)
- Digital infrastructure (enabling digital connectivity)
- Digital industries and innovation (integrating digital opportunities in business)

#### Property Preparedness: What every WA resident can do

- **Keep your property well-maintained** clear away dry leaves, branches, and rubbish that could fuel fires or block drains.
- Trim and manage vegetation this helps reduce bushfire risk and limits damage from storms.
- **Secure loose items outside** furniture, tools, toys, and anything that strong winds could pick up and throw.
- **Inspect your roof and gutters** fix damage and keep gutters clear to prevent leaks and flooding.
- Clear access ways- make sure emergency vehicles can reach your property quickly and safely.

**Prepare an** <u>emergency kit</u> with essentials: water, food, medications, important documents, and first aid supplies.

#### For those in Bushfire-Prone Areas

- Cut the grass around your property to 10cm or less.
- Prune thick shrubs or remove any vegetation from against your home create a minimum 2m gap between your house and tree branches.

Move any wood, mulch, or flammable materials away from the outside of the house.

#### For those in Cyclone and Flood-Prone Areas

- Check and reinforce windows and doors; consider installing cyclone shutters or storm-proof screens.
- **Plan for power outages**, have a supply of batteries, torches, and a portable radio. Elevate or protect electrical outlets, appliances, and valuables if you are prone to flooding.

#### Tips for renters and landlords

- Renters: Report any maintenance issues promptly and know your evacuation plans.
- Landlords: Regularly inspect and maintain your properties and share emergency plans with tenants.



#### Labor failing Murchison families with stalled School Dental Van Service

Member for Mid-West and Leader of The Nationals WA Shane Love MLA has slammed the Cook Labor Government for failing to deliver the School Dental Van Service to the Murchison, leaving children without access to vital oral health care since 2023.

Mr Love said that schools in Yalgoo, Mt Magnet, Meekatharra and Cue have now gone two years without a visit from the School Dental Van.

"The Government promised that a new, larger dental van was under construction and would be ready by late 2024," Mr Love said.

"Yet here we are in August 2025 — and still, there is no van, no service, and no certainty for families."

Mr Love said the absence of the service was particularly damaging for the Murchison, where children already face unique health disadvantages.

"These towns are remote — up to 420 kilometres from Geraldton — and families simply do not have alternative access to dental care," he said.

"Without this service, children in the Murchison are being left behind and placed at greater risk of serious health problems later in life."

"I've heard of children as old as seven who have never seen the dentist before."

Today Mr Love received a response from the Minister for Health, who blamed a manufacturing defect and ongoing staffing challenges for the continued failure to deliver the dental van service.

"If your family car was recalled for a defect, you wouldn't accept waiting two years for a replacement — yet that's exactly what the Minister expects families in the Murchison to endure."

Mr Love has called on the Cook Labor Government to immediately deploy a van and guarantee that students in the Murchison will not miss out on another year of dental care.

"The Cook Labor Government must stop making excuses. Our children's health cannot wait."

#### Rescue Helicopter fleet upgrade ignores the Mid-West

The Nationals WA have condemned the State Government for once again ignoring expert advice to base an emergency rescue helicopter in the Mid-West, while pouring \$26.7 million into new aircraft for Perth and the South West.

Leader and Member for Mid-West, Shane Love MLA, said the latest investment would do nothing for communities north of Perth where access to emergency services is already stretched.

"By concentrating every rescue helicopter in Perth and Bunbury, the State Government is denying thousands of Mid-West residents access to a life-saving services," Mr Love said. "This is despite repeated warnings from the Department of Fire and Emergency Services, the State Coroner, and the Chief Health Officer that our rescue helicopter fleet must expand into the regions."

Mr Love said the Chief Health Officer's landmark 2022 Inquiry into WA's aeromedical services – which called for urgent expansion – had been "virtually discarded" by the Cook Labor Government.

"It's diabolical that a government boasting multi-billion-dollar surpluses continues to ignore its own experts and the communities of the Mid-West on such as critical issue. "Meanwhile, they continue to push forward with a \$217 million racetrack and a billion-dollar redevelopment of the Perth Convention Centre while delivering substandard regional healthcare."

Member for Geraldton Kirrilee Warr MLA said the decision showed regional lives were not valued equally under WA Labor.

"Unless you live in Perth or the South West, you are simply not a priority for this Government," she said. "Geraldton is one of the busiest regions for the Royal Flying Doctor Service and St John Ambulance, yet we are left without a rescue helicopter that could save lives on our roads, at sea, and in remote areas."

Ms Warr said the Government had already broken its promise to establish a RFDS base in Geraldton, and its refusal to back a Mid-West rescue helicopter was "further proof" of its disregard for regional health.

"In an emergency, every second counts. Right now, people in the Mid-West are forced to wait, and that wait could cost lives."

Shadow Minister for Emergency Services, Hon Rob Horstman MLC, said that every West Australian deserved equitable access to life-saving services.

"The Inquiry into Aeromedical Services was clear, doubling our rescue helicopter fleet is the priority, yet two years on communities in the Mid West and northern WA remain dangerously exposed." "Emergency response can't be a postcode lottery.

The Government talks about modernising our fleet yet ignores the glaring gap in the Mid West," Mr Horstman said.


