Local Government Extraordinary Election

An Extraordinary Election by postal vote will be held on Thursday 24 September to fill one vacancy on Council, with the term expiring on 16 October 2027. Murdoch University Vet Program

A reminder, the Murdoch University Vet Program will be in Cue on Thursday 8 October 2026. Students from the University will be providing free pet checks and sterilisation under the guidance of a senior veterinarian. Other services available include microchipping and vaccination at the owner's expense. Please note this service is provided by the Shire of Cue and is only for dogs and cats registered with the Shire. Bookings are essential and can be made through the Shire office.

Shire of Cue Website

An internal review of the Shire of Cue website has continued during August, focusing on presentation, navigation, consistency and how residents and visitors interact with the Shire online.

A key improvement has been the introduction of an integrated online service request feature, allowing residents to report issues and submit service requests directly through the Shire website.

Work has also continued on the Discover Cue section, with tourism, heritage and visitor information being refreshed to better showcase Cue's attractions, history and local services. The review is also identifying further opportunities to improve public registers, access to information and the overall user experience, while making better use of the Shire's existing website platform.

Variety Bash Victoria rolls into Cue

Cue was delighted to welcome more than 80 colourful vehicles from the 2026 Variety Victoria Bash as they made their way across Australia on the "Wild Wild West" Bash. The 10-day journey travelled more than 5,200 kilometres from Halls Gap in Victoria to Exmouth, taking in towns including Tanunda, Port Lincoln, Ceduna, Madura, Kalgoorlie, Cue, Denham and Coral Bay along the way.

The Bash arrived in Cue on Monday 24 August, with participants enjoying a great feed, live music and a night camping under the stars on the town oval. The following morning, a community breakfast was held before the convoy continued on towards Denham. During the breakfast, the Bash crew also left a collection of presents for local children, which were later delivered to students at Cue Primary School.

The Variety Bash raises funds for Variety, the Children's Charity, supporting children who are sick, disadvantaged or living with disability. A big well done and thank you also goes to the Shire's Town Crew and Administration staff who helped prepare and present the town for the visitors, marked out the reticulation areas on the oval to ensure the Bash vehicles could camp safely, and assisted with catering and preparations throughout the visit. It was fantastic to see more than 80 uniquely decorated Bash cars making their way through the streets of Cue and to welcome so many visitors to our community.

The 2026 Variety Victoria Bash completed its journey in Exmouth on Thursday 27 August. Congratulations to everyone involved on an incredible trip across the country and thank you for making Cue part of the adventure.



Bubsie II

A little piece of Australian motoring history rolled into Cue on 27 August 2026. We had a special visitor, Bubsie II. Bubsie II is the same-model 1923 Citroën as the little car that made Australian history more than a century ago. On 4 August 1925, young missionaries Nevill Westwood and Greg Davies set out from Bickley, near Perth, in their tiny Citroën nicknamed Bubsie. Their original goal was simply to make it to Darwin, something no motor vehicle had previously achieved from Perth.

Their journey took them north through the Murchison, including Day Dawn and Cue, before continuing through Meekatharra and into country where there were few roads, few maps and very little mechanical support. After eventually reaching Darwin, the adventure grew into something much bigger. They kept going and Bubsie became the first car to complete a journey right around Australia.

More than 100 years later, Bubsie II is following in those tyre tracks, recreating this remarkable piece of Australian history, with the journey also being captured for a documentary project. It was fantastic to see this extraordinary little car back in Cue and Day Dawn country, following a route travelled by its predecessor all those years ago. For anyone who loves Australian history, old cars or a great adventure, the story is well worth exploring. There is also a brilliant episode of ABC Conversations with Richard Fidler, featuring author David Riley and the remarkable story behind Bubsie and the Boys. Community Reminders

Dog and cat owners are reminded of their obligations to keep their pets contained within the boundaries of their property. Pets must be on a leash while walking. Please be considerate of others as it can be quite confronting to be approached by an unknown dog while out walking. The Shire Ranger visits the area frequently and will take action against unrestrained pets in public places. This may result in a financial penalty to the owner. The only authorised area within the townsite where dogs are permitted to be exercised off leash is the town oval. It is your responsibility to control and look after your pets.

Mosquito fogging operations may be undertaken when weather conditions allow. Residents are asked to check their properties and remove any potential mosquito breeding areas, by emptying containers holding water, ensuring gutters are not holding water and checking yards for areas that hold water.

Council News

Hi 'Dryblower' Readers.

Council has been eagerly awaiting the upcoming Local Government election to be held on 24 September 2026 to fill the vacancy as a result of the passing of long time Cue identity and Councillor, Ross Pigdon. Council currently sits with six Councillors and with two nominations received we will be keen to fill the vacancy.

I encourage all on the electoral roll to make the effort to cast a vote. Those who have nominated have taken the time to go through the nomination process and chosen to represent your community. It is therefore important to have your say on who you would like to be represented on Council.

Aside from the Shire of Cue preparing for the election the activities of Local Government continue to keep us all who are involved busy .

On 5 August I attended the Western Australian Local Government Association ('WALGA') State Council Information Forum which is held every two months. These Forums are informal briefing sessions and provides an opportunity for Councillors to be briefed on current events.

Mr. Rob Cossart is the Fuel Security State Controller. Rob provided the Forum with an update on the current fuel supply challenges. Some fuel issues are starting to re-emerge with the continuing Middle East crisis. Australia is reasonably well placed with increased supplies of diesel, unleaded and jet fuels. Major suppliers like BP and Shell are reporting no major issues with accessing fuel while industries do not have too many concerns.



Australia has approximately six to eight weeks of supply with further supplies enroute. The price of fuel is always a concern for motorists and industry users and with the Federal Government discontinuing with the reduction in excise you will have notice an increase in bowser prices. FuelWatch continues to monitor fuel outlets and reported that there were only six outlets that have price concerns. Rob mention that the agriculture sector is reasonably well prepared for the upcoming harvest and there should be little or no disruption in that sector. While the global market is volatile the Federal Government is confident of future supplies.



WALGA President, Mark Irwin provide an update on the State Government Review and sector consultation on the Community Sporting and Recreational Facilities Fund (CSRFF) and the Club Night Lights Program (CNLP). The Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries in Western Australia administers the Fund which is designed to help local governments and non-profit sports clubs build or upgrade sustainable infrastructure, such as clubrooms, changerooms, playing surfaces, and skate parks.



The H5N1 Bird Flu is now becoming a nationwide problem with the flu being transmitted to some mammals. It is a severe, highly contagious viral disease that has spread globally among wild birds, poultry, and various mammal species. Approximately 23 bird species have been hit by the flu and there is a report of the death of a dolphin. The most significant impact will be felt in the poultry industry.



WALG CEO presented a briefing on the State Council Performance Evaluation which is conducted biannually. State Councillors will be provided with information on the procedure and timeline of the upcoming Performance Evaluation for the current term.

WALGA Manager Association and Corporate Governance. Kathy Robertson and Sam McLeod WALGA Manager Commercial Services briefed the Forum on an external review of the sitting fees paid to the LGIS (Local Government Insurance Services) Board which will commence shortly. Consideration will also be given to streamline travel and accommodation expense payments for State Councillors.

The Forum was also briefed on the impact of the Miscellaneous Licences legislation which will financially impact those Local Governments which are having to retrospectively refund rates from 2017.

Council held its monthly Information Forum on 11 August and was provided with an update on the current business and programs underway in the Shire some of which included:-

- *Austin Street Historic Signs.* Felicity and Jason from Kaboom Toons have done a fantastic job of drawing on traditional designs, colours and lettering styles that reflect the history of Cue.
- Volunteers from Stormco visited Cue and delivered a holiday program packed with a variety of activities for the children and then spent time volunteering around the town.
- *NAIDOC Week* was well attended with a Campfire on Country.
- *Cue Youth Centre* welcomed a busload of young people from Meekatharra for a friendly basketball afternoon in Cue. This is a great initiative, and it is hoped that such an activity will create more opportunities for the young people of Cue and Meekatharra to connect through sport.
- *LGIS WA Tier 1 Safety Assessment* was carried out an action plan will be put into place.
- *EV Charging Station.* The Cue Roadhouse has recently installed a charging station.
- *Containers For Change.* The Cue Roadhouse is still acting as a Containers for Change Drop & Go point. Which is located next to the post office boxes where you can deposit your labelled bags of containers for processing.
- *The Western Australian Centre for Rural Health (WACRH)* visited Cue during the school holidays and provided a three-day program incorporating speech pathology and occupational therapy opportunities for the children of Cue.

There was also an update on the progress of the Masonic Lodge • Bell's Emporium • Bank of WA. The meeting was provided with an overview on the performance of the Cue Caravan Park and the Cue Aerodrome both of which have created economic opportunities for our town.

I attended the Murchison Regional Vermin Council Meeting ('MRVC') in Mt. Magnet on 12 August. The meeting provided an update on the ongoing maintenance program of the vermin fence and a rundown on the current financial status of the Council. The 2026/2027 Budget was also adopted by Council.

The CEO provided the MRVC FOI Statement for Council's consideration. Sections 94 to 97 of the Freedom of Information Act 1992 require an agency to prepare a Freedom of Information (FOI) Statement as a means to assist members of the public to exercise their rights under the FOI Act. This statement is required to be updated annually.

The meeting was preceded by the Audit, Risk and Improvements Committee meeting which recommended to Council the adoption of the 2026/2027 Statutory Budget.

On 18 August I attended to WALGA's Submission on *Australian Government Proposed Disaster Recovery Funding Framework* which was dealt with by State Councillors by way of a 'Flying Minute'. I thank CEO Richard Towell for his contribution in providing input into the submission.

Council adopt the Annual Budget for the 2026 - 2027 financial year. For early ratepayers Council offers an incentive for the payment of the 2026 - 2027 rates and charges by the single payment due date by way of a lottery draw for the cash prizes of:

- First Prize \$600
- Second Prize \$300
- Third Prize \$100.00

Cue Shire Council held its monthly Council Meeting on 18 August at which Council considered and approved the renewing the lease of Lot 592 Heydon Place, Cue to the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA).

Council adopted the Shire of Cue *Privacy and Responsible Information Sharing Policy* to meet the Shire's obligations under the Privacy and Responsible Information Sharing Act 2024.

Council also adopted the *Compliance Audit Return (CAR)* for the period 1 January to 31 December which provides an internal control to assess statutory compliance and covers areas such as disclosure of interest, official conduct, tenders for providing goods and services, delegation of power and duties and appointment of senior employees.

WALGA held a Selection Committee Meeting on 19 August to nominate representatives on the following Committees/Boards:

- Local Health Authorities Analytical Committee (LHAAC).
- Government House Trust Board of Management.

Elected Members and Local Government Officers are encouraged to nominate to take up roles in a variety of positions that come up from time to time.

The 2026 Variety Vic Bash visited Cue, Western Australia on Monday, August 24 as part of its "Wild Wild West" route from Halls Gap to Exmouth. The bash was well received with 82 vehicles on show.



The Variety Bash is Australia's iconic outback charity motoring event, where participants drive their cars that are at least 25 to 30 years old to raise money for:

- Children facing sickness.
- Children living with a disability.
- Children experiencing financial or geographic disadvantage.

That's about it for the moment and trust you get a better insight into the activities of your Shire and the hard work carried out by Councillors, the administration and outside crew staff.

At WALGA we are represented at the State and Federal level of Government. It is essential we work together as a community for the betterment of the town, you as residents and those visitors who stay in or simply pass through Cue.

Please feel free to contact myself or any of the other Councillors if you have a matter you need to bring to the attention of Council and the Administration. Council is always looking to the community to provide input into the future direction of our town.

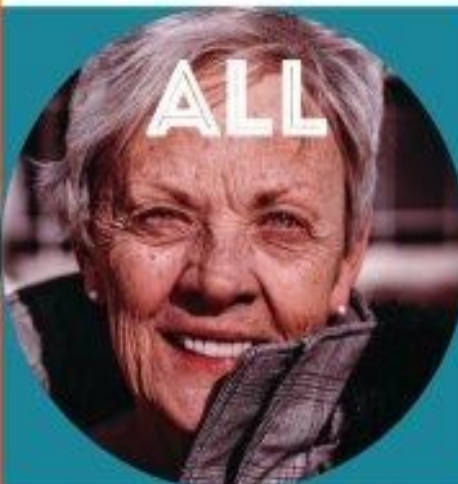
