**3.1 ANNUAL REPORT**

The Presiding Member presented the Annual Report for the year ending 30 June 2021.

Mr Martin King asked about the sustainability of the maintenance of the Shire's assets. The CEO responded that it's all considered in our long term financial plan.

Mr Martin King said the focus of the Shire is mainly on town not on pastoral leases. He declined to give any suggestions but will lobby the Councillors.

The Annual Report for the year ending 30 June 2021 was accepted.

Cr Les Price asked about the Miners Pass Road as it has potholes. Mr John Curtin explained the Shire has conducted maintenance and filled in the potholes.

Cr Liz Houghton said vehicles are speeding on Robinson St and it is difficult to enter Robinson St via private driveways. The intersection of Robinson St and Dowley St is also dangerous due to vehicles speeding.

Cr Ron Hogben requested a sign be placed on Price St indicating it is a "No Thru Road". Trucks are leaving the camp and turning into Price St trying to get back to the highway. Once they realise it's a dead end they reverse back out of Price Street and are damaging the kerbing.
